or given to the person in question. He indicated the agencies would be sensitive to these requests.

He did say that anonymous reports do not get investigated as rapidly, because in the past anonymous calls have been used as a way of getting law enforcement out of the way for illegal activity to occur somewhere else.

-Council approved a location for the restroom at E.H. Henry Park.

-Discussed the annual report from Johnson Controls, but tabled action on the matter. Council asked to have a representative from Johnson Controls explain the report.

-Agreed to disbursement of \$2,915 to the Chamber of Commerce from hotel-motel taxes for payment of expenses. It was noted that this tax revenue could only be used for tourism related expenses.

-Heard from Councilman Michael Cooper that property near Eagle Lake has been found to have trees with oak wilt disease. He said that the owner of the property was having their trees treated. Cooper said that he wanted the city to be aware that the disease is spreading and that given the oak trees in Eagle Lake, it is a situation that the city and its citizens should be aware of and monitor.
