All three delegates were co-sponsored by the Eagle Lake Rotary and the Eagle Lake Lions clubs.

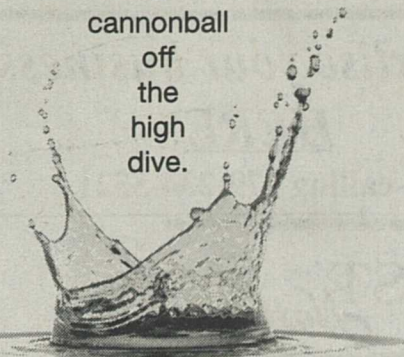
