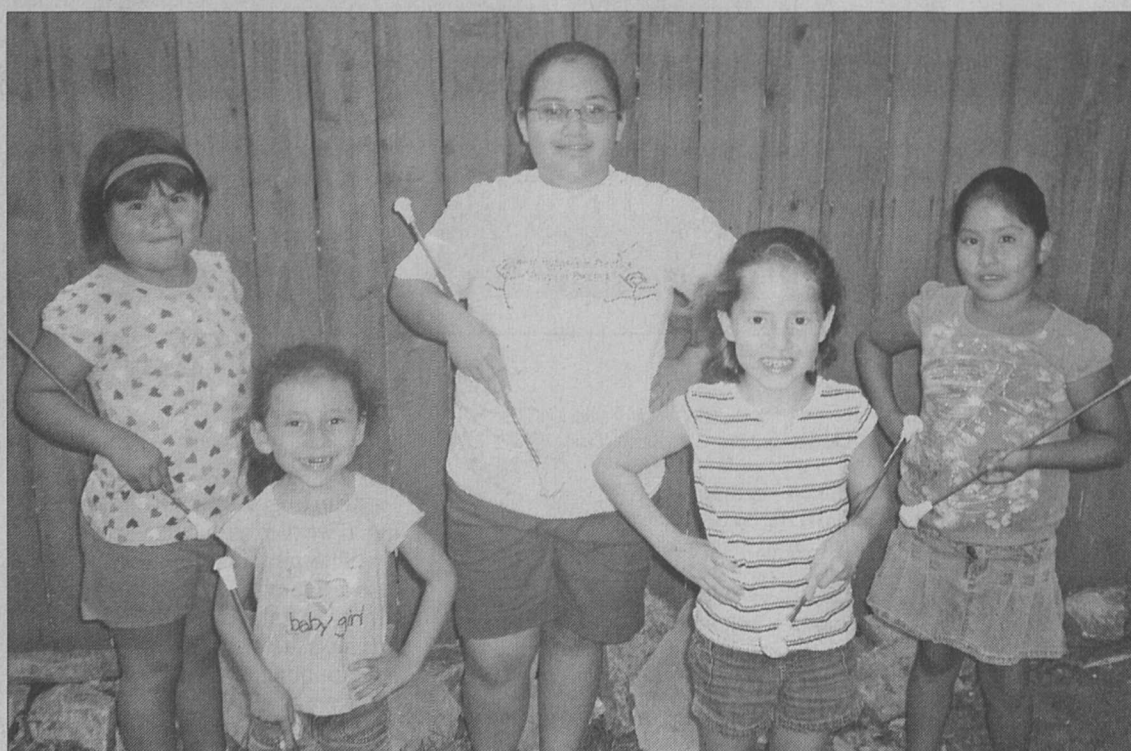
Folkins To Make Nesbitt Appearance

Gail Folkins, author of Texas Dance Halls: A Two-Step Circuit, will appear at the Nesbitt Memorial Library on Tuesday, July 22, at 7:30 p. m. The event is free and open to the public.
Folkins' book, which is profusely illustrated with photographs by J. Marcus Weekley, captures the sights, sounds, and history of eighteen Texas dance halls. Included among them are famous ones like Gruene Hall, the Broken Spoke, and Saengerrunde Halle in Austin, and several smaller nearby favorites, including Swiss Alp, Freyburg Hall, Wright's Park, Dubina Hall, Round-Up Hall in La Grange, and the KJT Hall at Ammannsville.
Folkins explores the origins of these halls, their glory days when they were packed with teenagers eager to hear the Triumphs, the Barons, or the Telstars, and their current operations and management.
Originally from Issaquah, Washington, Folkins studied English and journalism at Washington State University, wrote for news-

papers in the Pacific Northwest, and wrote creatively on her own. She has worked as a journalist, a writer/editor overseas, and a writing instructor.
After moving to Austin in 1989, she worked as a writer/editor for several companies, including National Instruments. She began teaching after receiving a master's degree in English at Texas State University. She joined the graduate program at Texas Tech University in 2003, completing her PhD in creative nonfiction in 2006. In addition to the dance hall book, she has published essays, articles, fiction, and poetry.
She got interested in Texas dance halls while traveling with her husband, John, a musician who played at them. "I would go along with John on the weekends and I really liked the sense of history and place I found in the dance halls," said Folkins.
To illustrate her book, Folkins turned to Weekley. The two had known each other during their days working on graduate degrees in Texas Tech's creative writing



program. For Weekley, who is also a poet and writer, he found that the assignment changed his view of the Texas dance hall.
"I had never been to a dance hall in my life," he said. "I thought, there's going to be cowboys and beer and country music. That was way wrong."
Folkins will speak about her experiences in researching the book, then sign copies for the audience. Copies will be available for purchase.
