Students are trained and encouraged to complete courses as rapidly as desired while learning practical skills for career enhancement and post-high school studies.

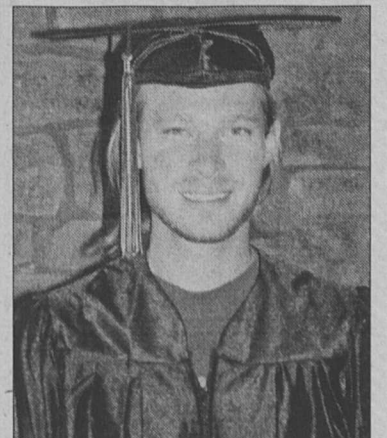
A special component is designed to help under performing athletes make up academic failures to become eligible for UIL competition, while developing body strengths, positive attitudes, and moral character needed to become team starters.

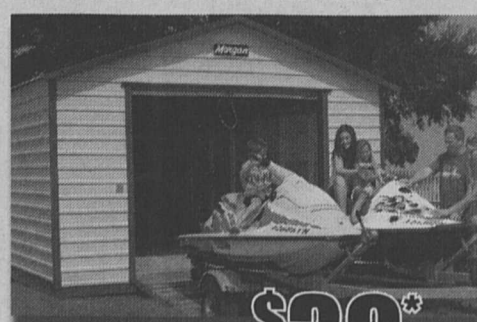
