TPWD Amends Non-Game Regs.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission acted Aug. 21 on staff recommendations to amend regulations on prohibited non-game species.

Among the changes approved by commissioners:

- Extend "grandfather" period for possession of prohibited non-game species for noncommercial use to Nov. 1, 2010.
- Allow for possession, captive breeding and sale of prohibited non-game species from out-of-state sources.
- These are relatively minor changes to rules that were established in October 2007," said Matt Wagner, Ph.D., TPWD's Wildlife Diversity Program director.
- "Among other things, the rules created a 'white list' of non-game wildlife legal for commercial collection and sale under the proper permit.
- "Conversely, all non-game species not on the 'white list' are prohibited from commercial collection in the wild."
- According to Wagner, TPWD biologists are most interested in hearing from collectors who keep box turtles and other prohibited non-game.
- "It appears box turtles are the most common of the prohibited species, and some of the collections are pretty significant," he said.

"We want to know who those folks are and what they have in possession."

Wagner pointed-out that contacting the department during the "grandfather" period can actually help turtle owners.

"We understand that collections change over time, especially for people who are breeding these animals," Wagner said.

"But sometime down the road, if a collector gets checked by a game warden and the game warden contacts us, we can say, 'We have a record of that.'"

This person has made a good-faith effort to comply with our regulations."

Wagner said TPWD biologists also are conducting several studies on turtles.

One with Texas A&M University is reconciling TPWD export records of non-game species with U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service records.

Additionally, the TPWD Wildlife Diversity Program has recently published a turtle identification tool called "Texas Turtle Regulations," available on the department's Web site.

TPWD Gives Deer Improvement Tips

Broadleaf plants, commonly called forbs, weeds or wildflowers, are the most important food items in the white-tailed deer's diet.

However, they are seasonal and, consequently, not always available.

During the spring and early summer, forbs constitute much of a deer's diet.

Woody browse species become more important as the range dries through the summer and forbs become less abundant.

Browse species are not as high in protein as forbs, but they are available on a year-round basis.

In essence, they fill the gaps between the forb seasons.

Therefore, browse plants play an essential role in the deer's diet.

Cattle will utilize all of the browse species that deer prefer.

When grazing systems or range conditions put cattle and deer in competition for browse, deer are less competitive.

Excluding cattle from wooded areas, and especially bottomlands, can eliminate this competition.

Bottomlands are richer soils and usually have more browse species than upland sites.

Fencing the cattle out year-round is preferred, but they should be excluded at least from September through February.

This will provide additional forage for deer while only slightly reducing cattle forage.

This practice becomes even more important to deer and other wildlife during drought or stress periods.

Another beneficial management practice is to fence out a few acres of native pasture to provide fawn nursery areas since adequate ground cover is essential to reduce fawn mortality from coyote depredation.

Before fawns start to follow their mothers, does like to leave them in tall grassy areas.

Often hay meadows are the only sites that provide this habitat.

As a result, fawns are often killed when the first cutting of hay is made.

Coyote predation can play a major role in suppressing a deer population in overgrazed areas by taking a high percentage of the fawn crop.

The elimination of grazing in the fenced out native pasture will result in a heavy stand of grass, which provides excellent fawning sites.

The increased ground cover will aid in reducing fawn losses to predators.

Although coyotes may take an occasional adult deer, it is the depredation of the fawn crop that is the major negative impact on the deer population.

It is important that landowners take responsibility to maintain and improve habitat to ensure the future of wildlife.

The key to wildlife is good habitat.

Private landowners control the future of wildlife in Texas and, therefore, the TPWD is committed to help any landowner seeking assistance.

It is also important to understand that the level of improvement is correlated with effort expended, and that results may not be immediate.

Every year 4-H members across the County and the State of Texas get an opportunity to participate in Calf Scrambles.
