The 2008 edition of the Colorado County Fair will get underway with the 30th Annual Fair Queens' Pageant slated for Saturday, Sept. 6, at the Columbus High School Auditorium.

The event will begin at 7 p.m. with the Junior Queen Contest, followed by the Queen's Pageant immediately after. The new fair queens will be chosen from a field of 15 young ladies from across the county who have entered.

The contestant selected Fair Queen by an out-of-county panel of judges will receive the \$1000 Leslie Schmidt Heard Memorial Scholarship.

The contestant who sells the most advance season passes to the fair will be named Membership Queen and will be crowned at the fair Thursday, Sept. 11.

She will receive the \$2000 Pamela Potter Honorary Scholarship and a life membership in the fair

association. The first runner-up will receive a \$750 scholarship and the second runner-up in sales will be awarded a \$500 scholarship.

Carl Geisler of Columbus will serve as master of ceremonies and Katelyn Hobaugh, also of Columbus, will provide music at the piano.
