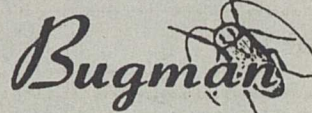

The Gadabouts November meeting will be on the 20th at 11 a.m., at Helen Noteboom's home, with a covered dish luncheon.

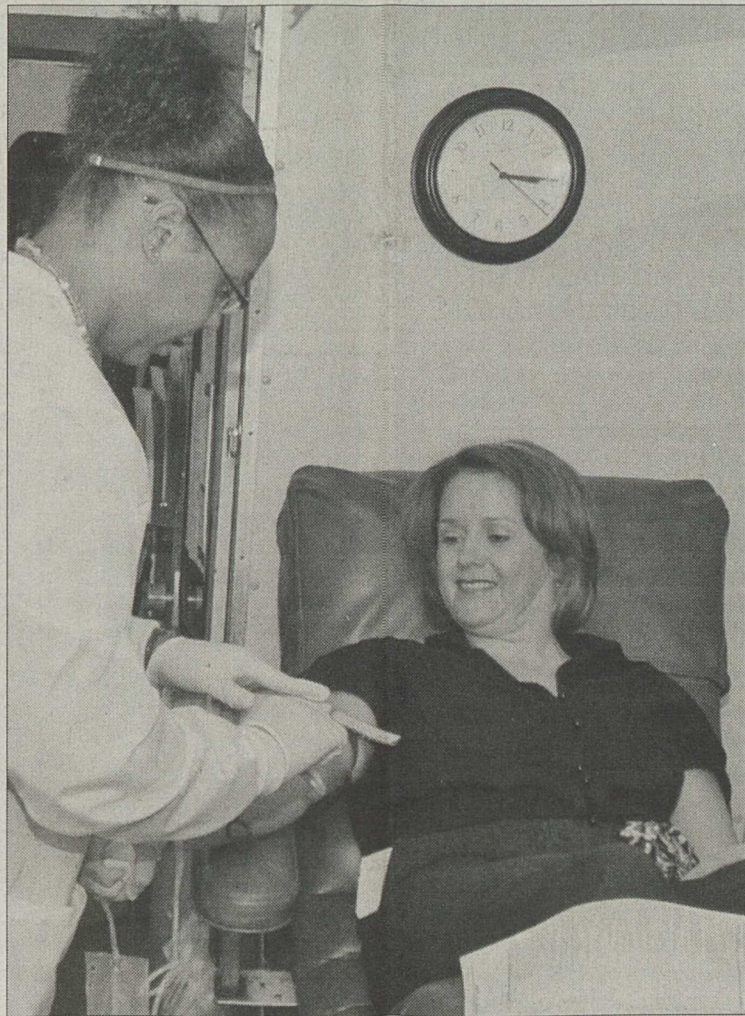
