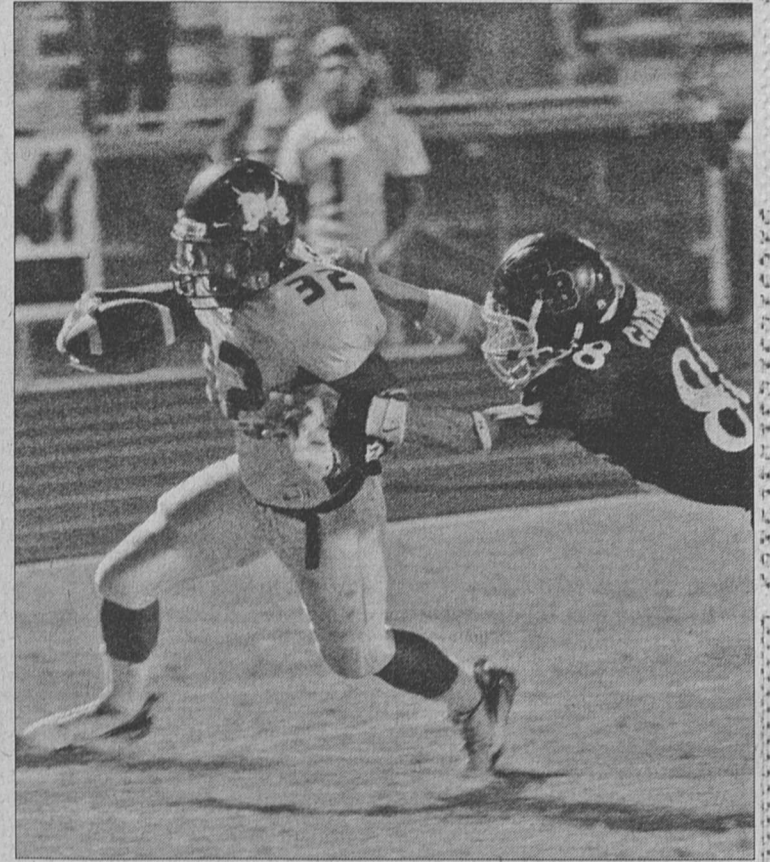


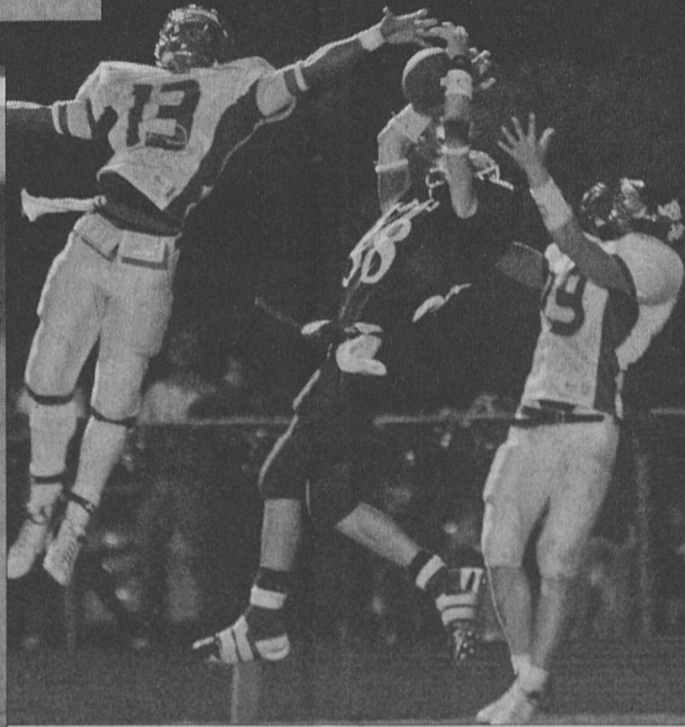
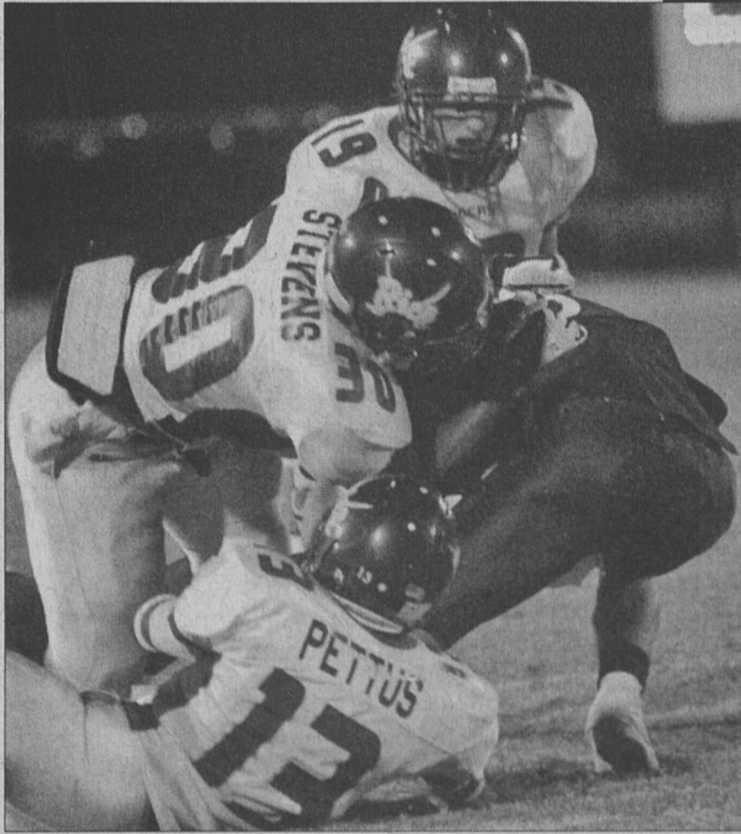

Raiders Beat Hallettsville In Double Overtime

Hallettsville tried a fake, but came up short, giving Rice excellent field position at the 34.

Unfortunately the Raiders were unable to capitalize and turned the ball over on downs.

The Brahmans were able to move the ball across midfield and gained their first down, but J.J. Reggins picked off a pass attempt to give the ball back to the Raiders at the Rice 31.

Rice drove the ball to about midfield, but the drive sputtered and the Raiders were forced to punt.

Hallettsville broke the first big play of the game, a 41-yard run, down to the nine-yard line.

The defense held inside the ten, forcing a Brahma field goal attempt, but a Raider offside penalty moved the ball closer and they decided to go for the touchdown from about a yard out.

They punched it in and after making the extra-point, the Brahmans led 7-0 with 8:28 left in the first half.

The Raiders were unable to get anything going and went three-and-out.

In fact, both defenses refused to yield and the offenses were forced to three-and-outs four consecutive possessions.

The half came to a close with the score 7-0 in favor of Hallettsville.

The Raiders got the ball to start the second half.

They drove to around midfield, but a fumble turned the ball over to the Brahmans.

Hallettsville took over at the Raider 44.

Aided by a personal foul against Rice, they moved down to the 18. After a couple of short runs and a Raider offside penalty, they had a first and goal at the five.

Three plays later they found the end zone again on a one-yard carry.

The Brahmans messed up the snap on the extra point and tried to throw the ball for a two-point conversion, but it fell incomplete.

The score was 13-0 in favor of Hallettsville with 3:28 left in the third quarter.

Rice got the ball at the 39 to start their drive and Dumont connected with Toliver for a 39-yard gain, but a 15-yard unsportsmanlike penalty took the ball back the Brahma 40.

On the next play, Dumont hit Toliver again, this time for an apparent 40-yard touchdown, but there was another flag on the field. This time it was for offensive pass interference, which pushed the Raiders back to the Rice 45. After a short run, and an incomplete pass, it was third and 22.

Dumont connected with Toliver on the left side, where he pitched back to Foster on the hook

and ladder play. Foster made it to the 38, where it was fourth and eight.

Unfortunately, the Raiders were not able to convert and turned the ball over to Hallettsville at the 41.

The Raider defense came up huge and forced a three and out.

After a punt, Rice got the ball back at their own 26 with 12 minutes to play in the game.

Foster went right to work, ripping off a 21-yard carry to the 47.

He got loose for 36 on the next play to the Brahma 17.

He carried again for 14 yards to the three.

They gave Foster the ball one more time and he found his way to the end zone for the Raiders first score. In just 1:19 seconds and four plays, the Raiders were in business.

Dumont hit the extra point for to make the score 13-7 in favor of the Brahmans with 10:41 to play.

Hallettsville got the ball at the 20.

After another unsportsmanlike penalty on the Raiders, the Brahmans had a first down at the 33.

They pushed the ball to around midfield, but some big defensive plays stopped the Brahmans in their tracks.

They were forced to punt the ball away.

Rice took over at the 13, and after a pair of nine yard carries by Foster and Dumont, had a first down at the 30.

The drive stalled out and Rice was forced to punt again.

The Brahmans got the ball at the 22, and began milking the clock, which showed 6:23 left in the game when they took over.

They pushed the ball out towards midfield, but stalled after the Raiders stuffed a couple of runs for short gains or no yards.

They punted the ball away and the Raiders took over at their own 22, needing a touchdown, and having only 143 seconds to get it.

The first play was a run by Foster for 17-yards to the 39.

After an incomplete pass, Foster broke off another 21 yards to the Brahma 40.

With the clock rolling under two minutes, Dumont dropped back and lobbed a pass, hitting Toliver in stride. When the dust settled, the score was tied at 13, with the extra point pending.

An apparent illegal procedure penalty by the Raiders meant that the extra point would be from 25 yards. The kick missed its mark, leaving the score tied with 1:58 left in the game.

The Brahmans got the ball at the 31, and tried to drive. They pushed to midfield, but were forced to punt after the Raider defense made a stop on third and three.

Rice got the ball with 22 seconds, but time ran out and the game would have to be decided in overtime.

Hallettsville won the toss, and chose to go on defense first.

The Raiders started at the 25 and were unable to move the ball.

On fourth and seven, they failed to convert, giving the Brahmans the opportunity to win the game with any score.

The Raider defense stepped up and turned the Brahmans away on a fourth and three attempt.

The Raider defense had to stay on the field, as the Brahmans were on offense to start the second overtime.

Again, the defense forced Hallettsville into a fourth down, but they converted this time, pushing to the 13.

The quarterback kept the ball for six yard to the seven-yard line.

He ran again for another yard to the six.

The Raiders stuffed the next play for no gain, bringing up another fourth down.

The quarterback again ran the ball but the Raiders held him to two yards, one yard short of the first down.

Now the Raiders went on offense, with the chance to win with any score.

Dumont carried the ball for four yards on the first play.

On the next play, Foster broke free to the right side then beat the defense to the corner and headed up the sideline for the game-winner.

Additional defensive standouts on the night were: J.J. Reggins, 7 total tackles, 3 solo, interception, 2 passes broken-up; Cody Lantelme, 7 total tackles, 1 solo; Chris Dorsey, 7 total tackles, 1 solo, 1 for loss, 2 passes broken-up; Jeromae McAfee, 7 total tackles, 1 solo, 1 for loss.
