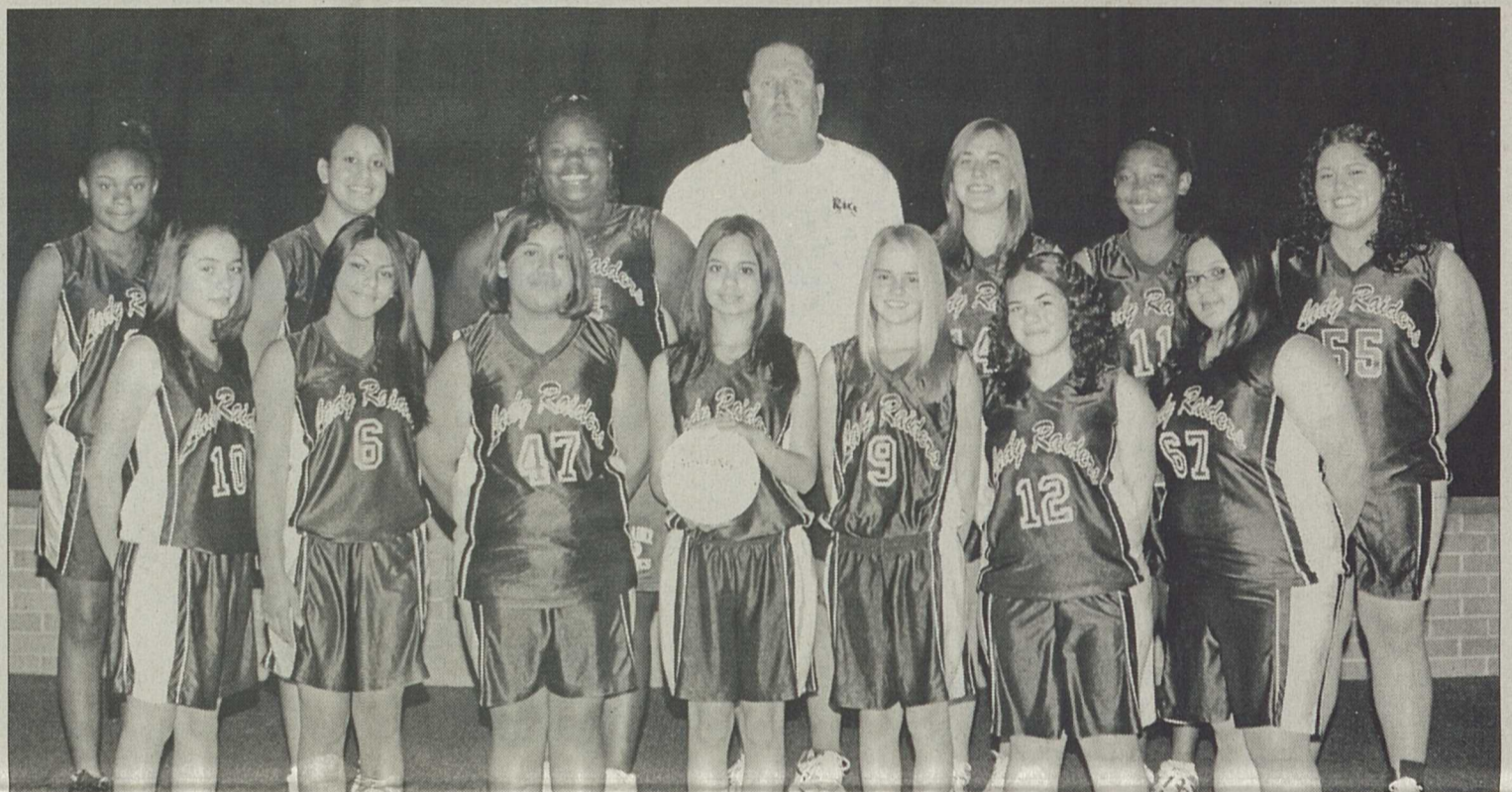

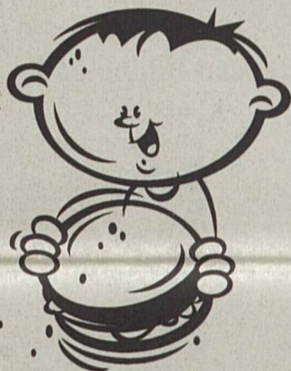

Halloween Safety Tips Given

By Texas Department of Health and Human Services

For parents on Halloween night, much of the fun lies in pretending to be terrified by half-pint vampires with sparkly pink hair clips and chocolate-stained hands.

But when your own kids are out trick or treating, the make-believe terrors of Halloween can turn real in a hurry, unless you've taught your young goblins and wizards how to safely enjoy their

night of sugar-fueled adventure.

You can start by sharing the following advice from the Texas Department of State Health Services.

For kids:

Trick or treat only at houses you're familiar with and only when the porch light is on.

Look both ways before crossing streets and cross only at corners.

Never step into the street from between parked cars, trees or other large objects that might

prevent drivers from seeing you.

Stay away from pets you don't know.

Halloween activity can frighten even the gentlest animal and they may feel threatened by costumes.

Stay on sidewalks whenever possible.

If there's no sidewalk, stick close to the left side of the road facing traffic.

Before leaving, check your flashlight to make sure the batteries are fresh.

Never accept rides or treats from someone in a car or truck.

Choose costumes that glow in the dark, or add reflective tape or paint so you can be seen at night.

If your costume's mask blocks your vision in any direction, use face paint instead.

Choose a costume that's short enough to reduce the risk of tripping.

Some costumes may be flammable, so stay away from lighted candles, lanterns or other sources of flame.

Don't eat any Halloween treats until an adult has checked them.

For adults:

Keep jack o' lanterns and candles away from anything that could catch fire, including costumes and decorations made of paper, cardboard or plastic.

Clear your yard of potentially dangerous or breakable items such as ladders, toys or tools.

Don't let children under 12 go out alone.

They should be accompanied by buddies and, preferably, an adult.

Know the route your trick-or-treaters are planning to take.

Wear a costume if it helps you get in the Halloween spirit, but remove your mask while driving.

If your kids' costumes feature items such as knives, swords or light sabers, make sure they're soft and flexible.

If you're driving trick-or-treaters around the neighborhood, make sure they enter and exit the car on the side away from

FIRST DENTAL VISIT

When Less is More With Your Child

The adage "less is more" applies well to preparing a child for her first dental visit. Parents often feel it is their obligation to fully inform their children of what will happen at a dental visit. This, regrettably, is unwise when dealing with young children. Keep in mind that fear is a learned response. If you tell your child that you are afraid, or even offhandedly say something like "I'm glad it's your turn to go," this will create anxiety for your child. Similarly, if you mention needles and drilling, your child may need a sedative just to get him into the reception room!

Tell your child that the dentist is someone who makes sure your teeth are okay, and counts how many teeth you have. That will suffice for most children seven and under.

Older children can sometimes be given more information, but they will rarely need it due to their own past experience at the dentist. Call your dentist if you have any questions about your child's dental visit.
