Stinchcomb pointed out that past winners in the Texas contest have come from small towns and big cities and have included home-schooled students as well as private and public school students.

"One of the common characteristics shared by many of the winners has been having a teacher or parent who encouraged the student and took the time to help them plan a course of study of the fish leading up to the preparation of the final work," she said.

"No prior knowledge of fish is needed.

The Wildlife Forever Web site has a free downloadable lesson plan."

"Especially with students in the lower grades, their artistic skills are just beginning to develop," Stinchcomb added.

"The State-Fish Art Contest is an ideal way for these students to discover what they are capable of by competing at statewide and national levels.

The quality of the entries we receive is really amazing, and we are proud of the way Texas has been represented in past years."

The Texas Freshwater Fisheries Center is a facility of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department that incorporates a visitor center, educational programming and a production fish hatchery.
