## Cemetery Tours Slated Nov. 7-8

For the sixth consecutive year, people from Columbus' history will figuratively rise from the dead and greet people at their gravesites at the Nesbitt Memorial Library's Live Oaks and Dead Folks cemetery tour.

This year's tours will be on Friday, November 7, and Saturday, November 8, at the Odd Fellows Rest Cemetery in Columbus. Tours begin at 7:30 p.m. and leave every ten minutes thereafter.

The cast will feature some of the best performers from previous years, including Gary Chandler, Bob Gillespie, Amber Hollywood, Jim Kearney, Paulina Kearney, Bill Mosley, Sally Rogers, Betty Jo Seifert, and Tracey Wegenhoff. There will also be two newcomers: John Foard and Kerry Whitfill. Foard will play his relative Robert L. Foard, a Columbus attorney who had a Texas county named for him, and Whitfill will play her grandmother, Kayte Koliba, the first wife of longtime state representative Homer Koliba.

Other characters on the tour include Helen Hunt, who died in the flu epidemic right after World War I, Jacob Mattern, a grocer and influential citizen in the first half of the twentieth century, and Anton Meduna, who played in the most famous poker game in the county's history.

Bill Stein, who wrote the script and put the tour together, commented, "Columbus has had its share of interesting characters. We believe that everybody should have the chance to meet them, even if they are dead. We want everybody who comes to get at least one good laugh, and to learn at

least one interesting thing about the history of the town."

The Odd Fellows Rest Cemetery is located on the north side of Montezuma Street in Columbus, near its intersection with Speaksville Road. The tour should take about an hour and a half.

Tickets for the tour are available at the Nesbitt Memorial Library (529 Washington Street, Columbus), and cost ten dollars each. Persons who attend should expect to walk about the length of four city blocks. Advance tickets are recommended, but tickets will also likely be available at the cemetery. All proceeds go to benefit the library.

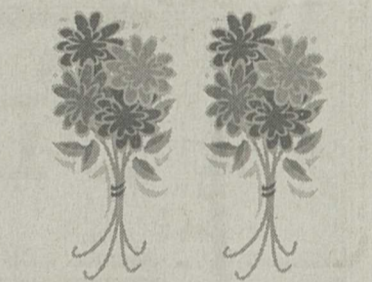

### Drug Treatments for Multiple Sclerosis

Multiple sclerosis (MS) is an autoimmune condition that affects the central nervous system. The term *sclerosis* refers to the scarring that occurs when the myelin sheath, which normally serves to protect nerve fibers of the central nervous system, is attacked. Ultimately, nerve signals that control muscle coordination, strength, and vision may be slowed or blocked in some manner. Typically, signs and symptoms of MS appear for the first time between 20 and 40 years of age. Numbness in the limbs, tingling sensation, vision loss or impairment, fatigue, and dizziness are symptoms that may occur. Although the cause of this condition is unknown, genetics may play a role. In addition, the condition may be triggered in response to a virus in some persons. There are different types of MS, and different types of treatment for each of the different forms.

For persons affected by *relapsing MS*, beta interferons are often prescribed. Interferon beta-1b (*Betaseron*) and interferon beta-1a (*Avonex*, *Rebif*) are reproductions of proteins that occur naturally in the body, and support the immune system. These medications are injected, and may reduce flare-ups, although they do not eliminate flare-ups. For persons affected by *progressive MS*, corticosteroids and muscle relaxants may be prescribed.



## Trout and Mushroom Piroshki

For those who love the traditional Jewish knish made famous on the streets of New York, the following recipe for "Trout and Mushroom Piroshki" from Michael van Straten's "The Healthy Jewish Cookbook" (Frog Books) is sure to please. Smaller than its potato-filled Big Apple counterpart, this Russian take on the knish is delicious whether it's served hot or cold.

### Trout and Mushroom Piroshki Serves 6-8

- 4 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 4 ounces trout fillet, cut into thin strips along the grain of the fish (about 1/2 cup)
- 4 ounces wild mushrooms, heads only, wiped clean and finely

- chopped (about 1 heaping cup)
- 1/2 cup vegetable broth or good-quality, low-salt stock cube or bouillon powder
- 1 sprig each of thyme, rosemary and parsley
- 1 1/2 cups creme fraiche (if unavailable, use sour cream)
- 1 heaping tablespoon chopped fresh dill
- 1 heaping tablespoon finely chopped chives
- 18 ounces frozen vegetarian pie dough, thoroughly thawed (or if homemade, enough pie dough for two 8-inch pies)
- Preheat the oven to 400 F. Heat 2 tablespoons of the oil in a large pan and gently saute the onion until soft. Place the sauteed onion and oil in a bowl. Put the remaining 2 tablespoons of oil in the pan, heat it, and add the trout.

Fry gently until it turns whitish -- about 20 seconds. Add the fish to the onion.

Strain the onion and trout juices back into the pan, heat them, and add the mushrooms, broth and thyme, rosemary, and parsley. Simmer for 3 minutes. Fish out the mushrooms and add them to the onion and trout. Strain the broth, then pour it back into the pan and reduce over a high heat until you have about 1 tablespoon left. Stir in the creme fraiche, onion, trout, mushrooms, dill, and chives.

Roll out the pastry dough and cut into 4-inch circles. Brush the edges with water. Put into a tablespoon of the mixture into the center of each circle, fold the dough over and seal the edges. Bake for 20 minutes.
