## Pedestrian Hit, Killed on I-10

A 27-year-old San Antonio man walking on Interstate 10 early Monday, Nov. 3, was killed when he was struck by a truck about 4.2 miles east of Weimar.

The man was identified as Alfredo Fonseca Jr. He was pronounced dead at the scene by Peace Justice Richard Luhrs.

The accident occurred about 4:27 a.m., according to a report by the Texas Department of Public Safety.

The driver of the truck was identified as Charles Demuth of Seguin.

According to the report, Fonseca was in the middle of the road when he was struck in the eastbound lanes.

One motorist who avoided hitting the man said he was standing, but the driver of the truck that hit him said he was lying in the roadway.

A car in which Fonseca was traveling with several relatives had broken down before the ac-

cident and was about a half-mile east of the accident scene.

One law enforcement official said Fonseca had been drinking, argued with other occupants of the vehicle and left that location on foot before the accident.

The accident was investigated by DPS Trooper Colby Havel. He was assisted by DPS Sgt. Gary Chandler and Troopers Stephen Pierce, Jeff Pickett, Royce Korenek and members of the Colorado County Sheriff's Office.
