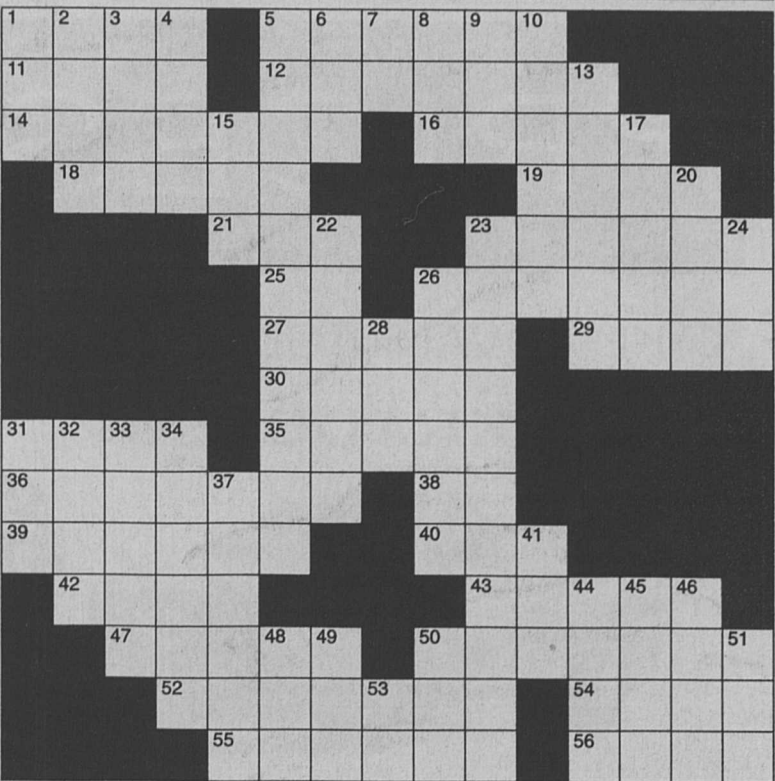

matching the description of the one stopped was carrying a large amount of cash, derived from criminal activity.

The bus was reported to be traveling from Atlanta to San Antonio and then was to travel further south.

Weimar Police Chief Bill Livingston said the tip was relayed from Weimar Officer Wayne Beum to Lt. Steven Khrovjak who saw the bus matching the description. The traffic stop was made by Officer Emil Martinez.

The bus was occupied by three Hispanic men who said they were bus drivers for "City Travel International, Inc."

The driver gave officers permission to search the vehicle.

Lt. Khrovjak and Livingston began searching the vehicle after it was stopped. Officer Paul Hilley arrived to assist at the scene.

Assistance was requested from Texas Department of Public Safety, as well as the Eagle Lake Police Department, which has a dog used for drug searches.

DPS Trooper Troy Clark arrived to assist, as did Eagle Lake Officer John Williams and his drug dog, Lulu.

The dog searched the bus and "alerted" on an area inside the bus.

Officers began searching that area and discovered packages located in the lower air conditioning vents.

The occupants of the bus were then detained for further investigation, and the bus was moved to

the Weimar Police Department.

The three denied any knowledge of the money, Sparks said.

No drugs were found in the vehicle, Sparks said, although the dog alerting on the area indicated there were traces of drugs on the cash.

The three men were identified and later released without charges.

Thirty-four packages, all individually wrapped and sealed, were removed and the monies were counted.

The packages contained a total of \$742,320.

This money was taken early Wednesday, Nov. 5, to First State Bank in Columbus and placed in the Colorado County Attorney's account.

Sparks then began forfeiture proceeding by filing a civil suit in district court, claiming that the money is contraband, from illegal activities.

The bus is still being held at Weimar Police Department for possible forfeiture, also.

If the money is forfeited, under a written agreement, 70 percent will go to the police agency that initiated the case, Sparks said.

Other agencies that assisted may also receive some of the proceeds, Sparks said.

The remaining 30 percent will go to the county attorney's office, under the agreement, Sparks said.

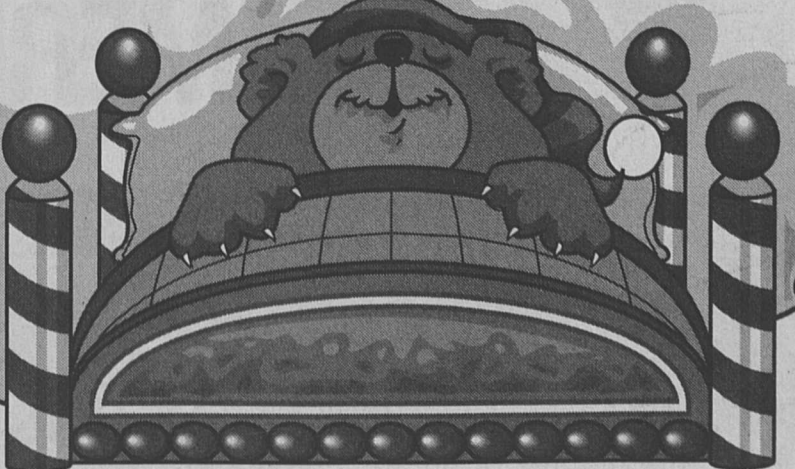
