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Cerebral Palsy Treatment Options

Cerebral palsy is a condition in which there is an impaired ability to coordinate body movements. The condition usually appears during early childhood, and may result from brain damage that occurred during the first stages of life. The cerebrum is the area of the brain that regulates sensation and voluntary motor function. Damage to this area may result in palsy. This condition may be caused by a maternal infection during pregnancy, genetic causes, or abnormal brain circulation before birth. Premature or low birth weight infants may be at an increased risk of cerebral palsy. Signs and symptoms may include decreased voluntary muscle coordination, muscle spasticity, stiff muscles, and difficulty speaking. Other symptoms include difficulty walking, difficulty swallowing, or difficulty with specific tasks, such as writing.

There are many treatment options available for persons affected by cerebral palsy. Non-drug treatment may include physical therapy, speech therapy, and occupational therapy. Medications also may be prescribed to alleviate symptoms. Muscle relaxants, such as Baclofen (*Lioresal*), work to reduce muscle spasticity. Persons who experience seizures may benefit from carbamazepine (*Tegretol*). Botulinum toxin (*Botox*) may be injected to help regulate muscle movement.

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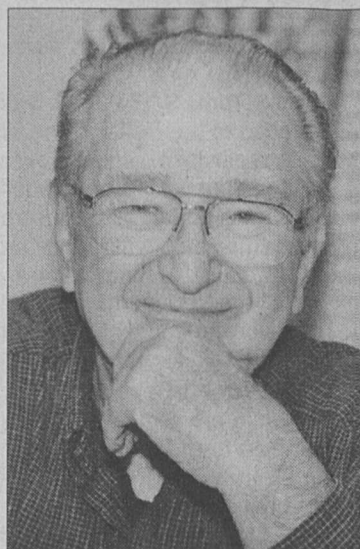

Leonard E. Bornstein

Leonard Bornstein, M.D. passed away at his home in La Habra, California on November 14, after a two year battle with cancer. His family states that he went peacefully and quickly, just as he had hoped. "Our family felt an overwhelming sense of gratefulness and relief that his struggle with cancer was finally over. His end of life wishes were accomplished and we were all with him at the end. There were so many little ways that God showed his mercy to our family. After he had gone, we all stood next to him and prayed together. Through tears we expressed sadness, but also a deep sense of peace and thankfulness for a life well lived, well loved and full of faith".

Dr. Bornstein was born in Central Falls, Rhode Island on March 20, 1936 to parents Benjamin J. Bornstein and Lena Urweider Bornstein. He has one sibling, an older brother, William R. Bornstein who is a retired pastor living in Florida.

Dr. Bornstein recalled a happy childhood fishing with his brother, visiting relatives in New York and New Jersey and attending many

summers of Boy Scout Camp. He remembers wanting to be a doctor as early as 5 years of age.

Dr. Bornstein's father was a textile mill manager in New England who later moved the family to Canada when he became part owner of Consolidated Textiles. Dr. Bornstein graduated with honors from Lower Canadian College. He came back to the U.S. for college graduating from Emmanuel Missionary College (now Andrews University) in 1958 with a degree in chemistry. He was accepted to Loma Linda University, School of Medicine, graduating in 1962. After a one-year internship at L.A. County General Hospital he entered the U.S. Air Force serving with the rank of Captain.

Upon completing his stint in the military, Dr. Bornstein went to Montebello California where he joined the Bergman Medical Group working as a board certified general practitioner for 30 years. It was during his first week of private practice that he met Bernice Smith who was to become his wife one year later, June 1966.

Dr. and Mrs. Bornstein bought a home in Whittier, California, where they raised their three children. They became members of the Whittier SDA church holding many church offices and continuing as faithful members.

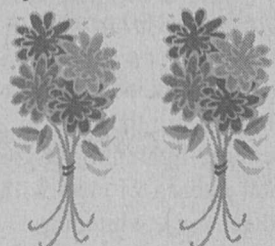
Dr. Bornstein came to Eagle Lake in the summer of 1995 to look at a work opportunity. He loved the country and the people, moving there in January 1996 where Dr. Bornstein worked with the Thomas Clinic and Rice Medical Center for 10 years before retiring. While there he was active in the American Legion, Men's Emmaus Reunion Group and mentored youth at the Colorado County Juvenile Facility and the Lighthouse.

Dr. Bornstein enjoyed time with his friends playing bridge, golfing, inter-faith discussions, meeting with friends on Friday evenings and bagging his first deer in Mason. He loved classical music, sports, rural Texas, and his family. He enjoyed his work as a medical doctor and always appreciated the opportunity to serve his community. Patients and friends alike loved and respected him not only for his medical expertise but for the godly man he was. He was generous and kind to those less fortunate. He will be remembered for his easygoing ways, his loving nature, his care of his family, and his love of God.

He is survived by his wife of 42 years, Bernice, now of La Habra, Ca. He also leaves his son, Bill, of Whittier, CA; his son Mark and wife Lina of Anaheim, CA; and his daughter, Krista Peyton, her husband, Joseph Peyton, and their daughter, Riley of Berkeley, Ca. He is also survived by his older brother and wife and their daughter and family, his 5 brothers-in-law, 5 sisters-in-law, and a multitude of nieces and nephews, plus many dear friends and former patients.

Khristi Jane Berger, 38, of Sealy, and formerly from Baytown, passed away on November 22, in Sealy.

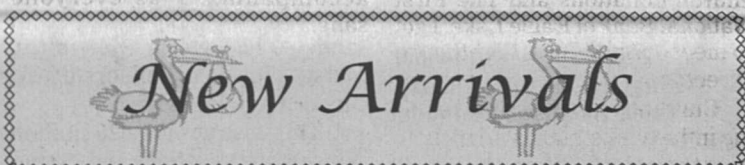

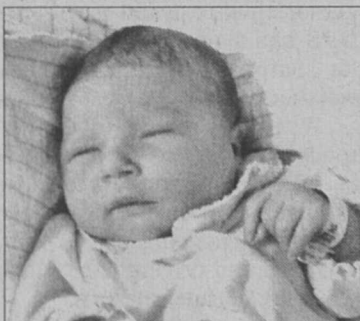
