Raiders Finish Season With 12-1 Record

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more heavily on the pass with 341 passing and 59 rushing.

Myles Dumont was 18 of 27 for 322 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran for one score in the game.

Ziggy Foster had a tough night carrying the ball with 55 yards but did have a 101-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the game.

Mario Hull had a big night for Rice with 11 catches for 175 yards and three touchdowns.

Marques Toliver had 116 yards on five catches on the night.

The Raiders got the ball to start the game and after moving the ball for a first down, were forced to punt when the drive stalled.

Kirbyville got the ball at the 30 for their first possession.

They took just four plays to score. They ran twice for one and 17 yards and threw twice for 12 and 40 yards. They scored on the

40-yards pass play.

With 6:52 left in the first, Rice was behind 7-0.

The Raiders answered back on their next possession.

They took the ball at the 20 to start their drive.

Foster broke loose for 19 on the first play and two plays later Dumont threw to Toliver for a 30-yard gain to the Wildcat 26.

A pass interference penalty pushed the ball to the 14, and after

two short runs Dumont hit Hull for a 10-yard score.

Cristian Samaniego made the extra point for a 7-7 tie.

Kirbyville hit right back with a seven-play, 62-yard scoring drive.

They ran the ball all but one play on that drive.

With a little more than a minute left in the first quarter it was 14-7 in favor of Kirbyville.

On the ensuing kickoff, Foster fielded the kick just inside the goal line and hesitated for a split second before running straight up the field. He came through the onslaught of tacklers and saw open field in front of him.

He headed toward the left sideline and beat the last man and sprinted the final 40 yards for the touchdown.

Rice then went for two and Dumont scrambled for the two-point conversion to make the score 15-14 in favor of Rice with 56 seconds left in the quarter.

The Raiders then surprised Kirbyville with an onside kick to the right side.

It was executed perfectly and Cody Lantelme recovered for the Raiders.

After three plays the Raiders faced a fourth and six at the Kirbyville 43, and decided to go for it.

Dumont threw to Hull for a 12-yard gain and the first down at the Wildcat 35.

He went right back to Hull on the next play, this time for 34-yards to the one yard line.

Dumont kept the ball and pushed into the end zone for the Raider touchdown on the next play.

A two-point try failed, and Rice led 21-14 with 10:40 left in the half.

Kirbyville answered with a 10-play, 66-yard scoring drive on their possession.

All of the yards came by virtue of the run, with the touchdown coming on a 29-yard jaunt.

Kevin Ellis blocked their extra-point attempt to keep the Raiders ahead by one, 21-20 with 6:18 left in the half.

Rice punched back on their next drive. On third and one from

TAX TIPS from RAY

The 2008 Stabilization Act generally allows a 5-year recovery period (instead of the previous 7-year period) for any machinery or equipment (other than grain bins, cotton ginning assets, fences, or other land improvements) which: 1) is used in a farming business, 2) the original use of which commences with the taxpayer after 2008, and 3) is placed in service before 2010. You are generally considered in the "farming business" if your business involves the cultivation of land or the raising or harvesting of any agricultural or horticultural commodity.

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BRUSHING BATTLES

My 1-year-old won't let me near her with a toothbrush. I know I should be brushing her teeth and gums, but how?

Forcing the issue is likely to backfire. The best approach is to take it slow. Start by cuddling your child in your lap. Sing or talk to her, and when she seems content, make a game of putting your clean finger up to her lips. After a couple of days, change the game by rubbing and massaging her teeth and gums with your finger. Move on to using a wet washcloth.

In a few months, when she's gotten used to this routine (and has more teeth), you can introduce a baby toothbrush again. Older toddlers love imitating Mom and Dad, so let your child "brush" your teeth with your brush before you clean hers with the baby toothbrush. Toothpaste isn't necessary, and children don't know how to spit it out until age 2 or 3. Then, use only a pea-size amount; swallowing too much fluoride can lead to fluorosis, which causes teeth to become discolored and mottled.

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
