crawl for 20 yards, surface dive to 10 feet and retrieve a 10 pound object and swim back to starting point within 1 minute, 40 seconds, and 3. swim three hundred yards continuously using the front crawl with rhythmic breathing and a stabilizing, propellant kick, and the breaststroke. Students must attend all classes, and pass all written and skills tests with a score of 80 or better.

Course fees for new students are \$140 (\$90 to Am. Red Cross for text books, pocket mask, valve, bandage kit, equipment usage fee and administrative fees); and, \$50 to local Red Cross for pool and instructor supplies.) Course fees for lifeguard renewals are \$50 and CPR renewals are \$40.
