County Tire Collection Set For April 15

Colorado County commissioners, meeting on Monday, approved a scrap tire collection to be held Wednesday, April 15, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Colorado County residents can

recycle scrap tires at the following locations:

- Precinct 1, 3334 County Road 106, Rock Island.
- Precinct 2, 404 S. Eagle, Weimar.
- Precinct 3, 1501 FM 109, Frelsburg.
- Precinct 4, 310 S. McCarty, Eagle Lake.

Automobile and truck tires only will be accepted.

Tires with rims will not be accepted.

Tires from businesses or commercial entities will not be accepted.

The Colorado County Scrap Tire Collection is being funded by a Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP) agreement with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ).

Copano Processing, L.P. entered into an agreement to create an SEP as the result of settlements of an environmental enforcement

action brought by TCEQ.

This collection is being sponsored by the Lower Colorado River Authority and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

In other action, commissioners approved rescinding an earlier action to Drymalla Construction Co. as a construction manager at risk for a courthouse restoration program.

County Judge Al Jamison said that proper procedure was not followed when commissioners Drymalla last week.

Commissioners noted that other companies should be allowed an opportunity to submit proposals to be construction manager at risk.

Commissioners agreed to table to get more information on the procedure to follow involving the selection of a construction manager at risk.

They also tabled for further study proposed by-laws for a new airport advisory board and a list of proposed members.
