LCRA, SAWS In Legal Dispute

However, the December 2008 LCRA actions have resulted in a failure to meet statutory requirements set forth in the 2001 legislation that was secured in partnership by both agencies and legislators in the LCRA basin as well as the San Antonio area, SAWS officials said.

However, a spokesman for the LCRA, Emlea Chanslor, said her agency's position is that it is not in breach of the agreement between the parties.

"Prior to their December 2008 decisions, all statutory requirements were being met," said Robert R. Puente, SAWS President/CEO.

"Through their actions, they have abandoned 180,000 acre-feet of water for their basin which would have been created by the project, and we've lost at least 90,000 acre-feet of water on top of

that," he added.

Under a definitive agreement between the two agencies, SAWS officials said, the entire LCRA basin was set to gain 180,000 acre-feet of water for the Colorado River basin through the use of enhanced technology and inno-

vative conservation efforts paid for by SAWS.

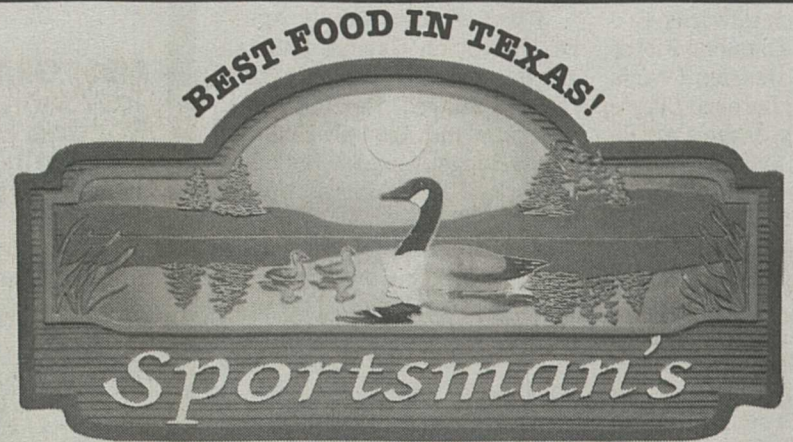
LCRA officials said recently updated studies, based partly on growth in the LCRA area, indicate the project to supply water to San Antonio would not generate the water required.
