Live music will be provided from 10:30 a.m.-9 p.m. featuring Texas Sound Czech, The Tony Janak Band, and The Red Ravens.

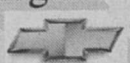

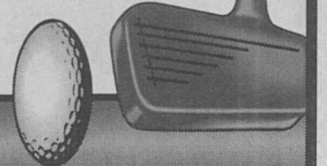
