

SBEC Elects Officers At Annual Meeting

On May 16, Chairman of the board, Gus Miller gently hammered the gavel as he called the 69th San Bernard Electric Cooperative (SBEC) annual membership meeting to order.

This year's meeting was held at the Austin County Fair Convention and Expo Center located in Bellville.

Registration opened at 8:30 a.m., and this year the members who attended were handed a ce-

ramic cookie jar.

The jars' detailed label shows the 70th anniversary inscribed on it signifying the number of years that SBEC has been in operation.

The members had the opportunity to visit various booths, which were manned by employees with information about safety, member services and government action.

Chairman Miller announced

that at 9:55 a.m., 254 members had registered which established a quorum sufficient to conduct the meeting.

The agenda items included the reading of the official notice of the annual meeting and proof of mailing, the recognition of special guests, the introduction of the credentials and election committee, the Chairman's report, the General Manager's report and the audit report.

One of the most important agenda items, of course, is the election of directors.

Directors' terms are three years and each director presides over a designated section within the SBEC service area called a district.

The nominee cannot be a SBEC employee nor have a relative who is employed by SBEC, but he or she must be a San Bernard member in the district for which he is running.

Each year on a rotating basis, three Directors run for election, and this year the terms of the directors from districts 3, 5 and

7 expired.

Bruce Pilcik was nominated from district 3, Sammy Condra was nominated from district 5 and Charles Matula was nominated from district 7.

All three nominees were incumbents and were uncontested.

After the Credentials and Election Committee counted the ballots, a report was given to Chairman Miller who announced to the membership that Bruce Pilcik, Sammy Condra and Charles Matula had been re-elected to serve another three-year term on the Board of Directors of San Bernard Electric Cooperative, Inc.

With no further business, Chairman Miller adjourned the business meeting.

Next, Billy Marricle, President/General Manager, called the names of the members that were drawn for door prizes and everyone enjoyed a barbecue lunch provided by Hinze's Barbecue and Catering of Sealy.

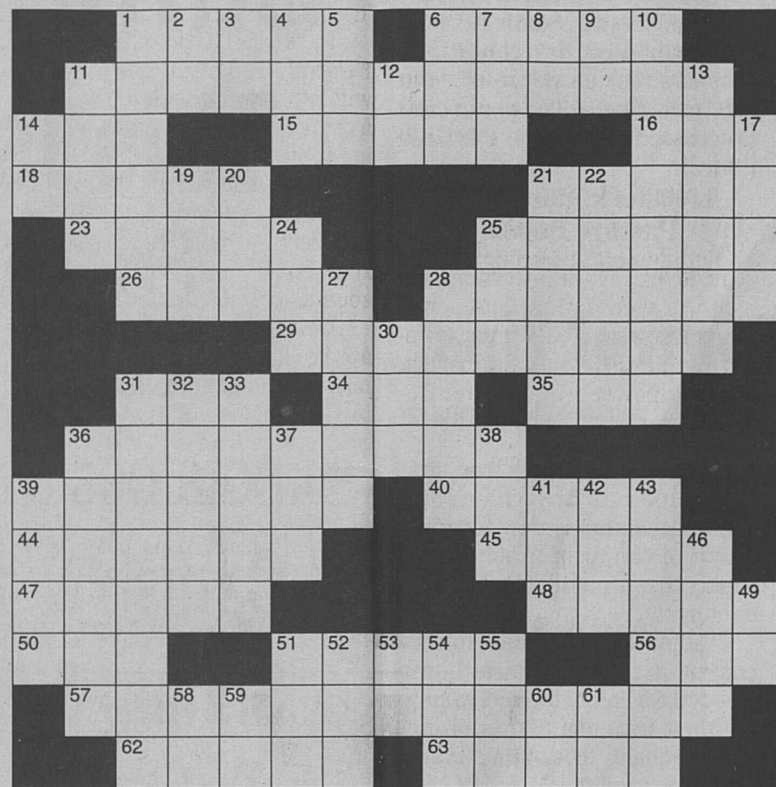


