## Attempted Burglary Suspects Apprehended

On June 29, 2009 at approximately 8:18 p.m. the Colorado County Sheriffs Office responded to an attempted burglary on Thomas Dryer Road, north of Eagle Lake.

Responding deputies were advised that an employee of 3TK Ranch had driven-up on two subjects in the process of gaining access to a building.

The employee attempted to stop the subjects from leaving the area and blocked their exit with his vehicle.

The suspects fled the scene by driving in the direction of the employee and his vehicle as if they intended to strike him.

The suspect vehicle veered to the left and drove through a fence. As they were exiting the property the employee fired shots at the vehicle's tires.

The vehicle then entered Thomas Dryer Road onto FM 102, where the employee lost sight of the vehicle.

An hour later deputies found that the suspects entered another property by driving through a fence, and fled through a pasture and became stuck in a gully, abandoning their vehicle.

Deputies received information that someone was possibly en route to pickup the suspects on Sunderman Road.

At approximately 11:15 p.m. Sgt. Staff observed a vehicle leaving the area of Sunderman Rd and FM 949. Deputy Martell and DPS Trooper Clark stopped the vehicle near IH-10 and FM 949 with two of the three occupants of the vehicle being arrested after they were linked to the attempted burglary

of a building at 3TK Farms. The vehicle in which the suspects fled was impounded.

As a result of the investigation Jose Sanchez, 25 of Houston and Carlos Urbina, 20 of Brookshire were charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, attempted burglary of a building, criminal mischief, and criminal trespass. Rogelio Oviedo, Jr., 29 of Brookshire was arrested during the incident for driving while license invalid.

As of July 6 the two burglary suspects were still in custody. The suspects appeared before Judge Truchard with bonds set at \$265,000.00 on Urbina's charges and bonds set at \$65,000.00 on Sanchez's charges.

The Colorado County Sheriffs Office was assisted by the Eagle Lake Police Department, Colorado County Constable Pct. 4, and the Texas Department of Public Safety.

### Crimestoppers Seeks Bank Robbery Suspect

On June 19, 2009 at approximately 2:30 p.m. an Aggravated Robbery occurred at the Fayette Savings Bank in Columbus.

The suspect entered the bank with a small caliber rifle and ordered all but one of the employees to the floor.

The suspect demanded a teller place the money from a teller drawer in a white bag. Suspect fled the bank on foot.

A possible suspect vehicle is an older white midsize car.

The suspect is described as a white male with dark tan, wearing a blue bandana, sunglasses and multicolored (mainly red) plaid shirt and faded blue jeans and work boots.

Witnesses state it appeared the suspect worked in the sun a lot, possible construction worker. Suspect height is between 5'10" to

6' tall, thin build, approximately 160 lbs with brown hair.

His estimated age is between 35 to 40 years old with deep raspy voice.
