Sealybration On Tap July 10-12

If summer has slowed you down, here's the "pick-me-up" that you've been looking for—the return of a local favorite festival the Sealybration at the BP&W Park, 1008 Main Street in Sealy, running from Friday, July 10 through Sunday, July 12. This family-oriented event that promises to keep everyone busy the entire weekend and create memories for a lifetime is sponsored by the Sealy Community Foundation, a newly-formed organization that serves as a voice for all non-profits with intent to advance education and charity.

Some of those "not to miss" activities: YMCA-sponsored motorcycle runs to live music, softball tournament, to beauty pageant, arts and crafts to activities for the kids—and don't forget the barbeque cook-off!

The ever-popular Fireman's Frolic (a big thank you goes to these folks) kicks off at 5 p.m. Saturday with a catfish dinner and a live auction. This will be held at the Sealy Knights of Columbus Hall on 1390 Hwy 90 West and options of eat-in or drive-thru are

available. A week-end party in Sealy would not be complete without music and the line-up is incredible—Southbound 955, Sealy Community Band, Brown Sugar, Grateful Geezers, Dub Miller, Django Walker, and Aaron Watson round out the fun. Everyone is encouraged to bring their dancing shoes!

Friday morning festivities kick off with the Barbeque Cook-off sanctioned by the Lone Star Barbeque Society to be followed by the opening pitch at 6 pm for the softball tournament. If you haven't seen a hometown ballgame in a while, here's your chance.

The evening comes to close with a free concert of the sounds of Southbound 955, a local group from Fayetteville. This young group formed a few years ago for competition and continues to attract an enormous following.

Saturday events commence at 10 a.m. with the opening of the arts and crafts booths (always a great way to do a little shopping under that fixed budget). The softball tournament and barbeque

cook-off continue and the food and drink stands and children's activities sponsored by local non-profit organizations will be open.

Live music will run non-stop throughout the day Saturday beginning at 12:30 with the local Sealy Community Band performing until 2 p.m. Brown Sugar (a local group with a soulful sound) picks up from 2:30 – 4 p.m., followed by the Grateful Geezers (always a big crowd pleaser with their blues, soul, and classic rock music) from 4:30 – 6 p.m. and Dub Miller (Texas country through his music) from 6:30 – 8 p.m. The evening wraps up with Texas Music artists Django Walker from 8:30 – 10 p.m. (who has co-written songs with artist Pat Green) and Aaron Watson from 10:30 – 12 a.m. (with a new recording "Deep in the Heart of Texas"). Saturday's admission before 5 p.m. is \$5 (children under 12 and adults over 65 free) and \$15 after 5 pm.

Sunday's events, running 12 p.m. - 5 p.m. are free and completes the Sealybration with final games of the softball tournament, and arts and crafts.
