Whitfield Retiring From Christ Episcopal

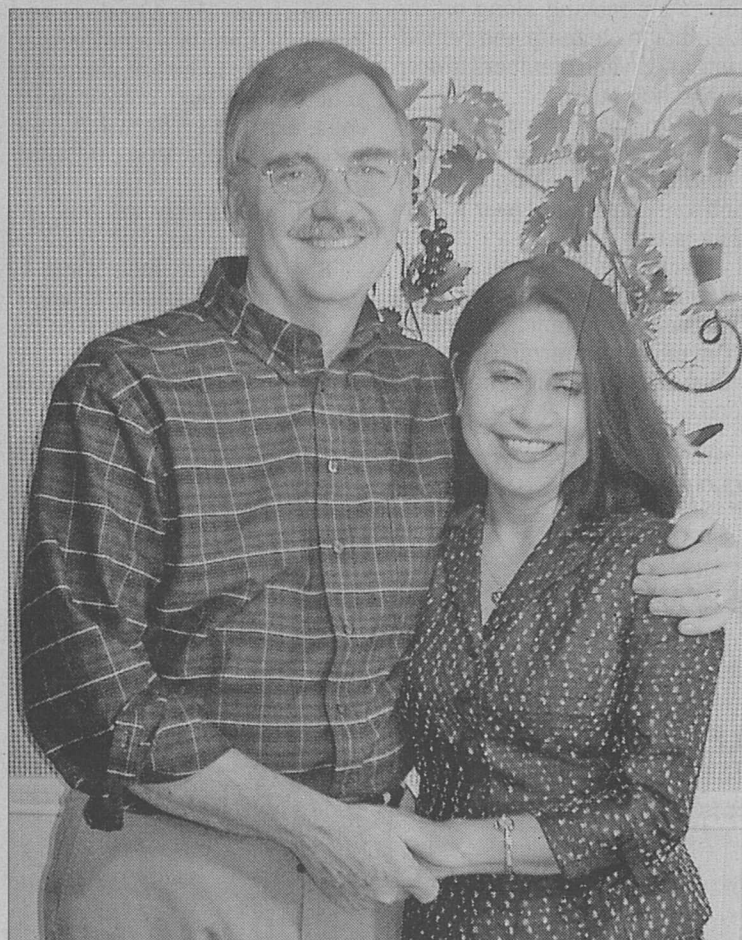
It is with regret that Christ Episcopal Church (CEC) announces the retirement of our Rector, Steve Whitfield, whose last Sunday with us will be July 26.
