AgriLife to Offer Food Manager Training

Statistics indicate that foodborne illness continues to be a health issue in the United States.

Each year, 1 in 4 Americans will become sick, 1 in 1,000 will become hospitalized, and 5,000 will die due to a foodborne illness says Sally Garrett, County Extension Agent-Family & Consumer Sciences.

If under the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) jurisdiction each food establishment is required to have one certified food manager on site.

Many of you have already received a letter from the Texas Department of -State Health Services regarding this. Under these new rules, each food establishment permitted by the Texas Department of State Health Services must have one certified food manager.

New food manager certificates will be valid for 5 years.

Texas AgriLife Extension Service, Fayette County, is offering a 2 day food manager certification training course.

This program will be offered for \$110 on August 31-September 1, 2009 at the Fayette County Ag Building, 255 Svoboda Lane, Room 104, in La Grange. Cost includes training, materials, and the State food manager certification examination.

This program is designed to not only prepare foodservice managers to pass the certification examination; it will provide valuable education regarding the safe handling of food. Almost 50 cents of every dollar Americans spend on food is spent on meals prepared away from home.

Therefore, careful attention to food safety will help keep customers safe and satisfied.

Foodborne illnesses are estimated to cost thousands of dollars in lost wages, insurance, and medical bills.

With these statistics, knowledge of how to prevent foodborne illness is essential.

The benefits of improved food safety include:

- Increased customer satisfaction
- Improved relationships with health officials
- Prevention of bad publicity and law suits due to foodborne illness
- By attending the course, foodservice managers will learn about:
 - identifying potentially hazardous foods and common errors in food handling
 - preventing contamination and cross-contamination of food
 - teaching and encouraging personal hygiene for employees
 - complying with government regulations
 - maintaining clean utensils, equipment and surroundings.

Drugs Used To Treat Peptic Ulcer Disease
Peptic ulcer disease causes an irritation of the gastrointestinal lining. Signs and symptoms of peptic ulcer disease include stomach pain, nausea, heartburn, and bloating. Stress may exacerbate the signs and symptoms of peptic ulcer disease. Stomach acid, non-steroidal anti-inflammatory medications, such as *ibuprofen* (Advil) and *naproxen*, may lead to ulcers. Also, infections from *helicobacter pylori* (*H. pylori*) may lead to an ulcer. While *H. pylori* is a bacterium that is commonly found in the stomach, in certain persons this type of bacteria actually leads to ulcers.
For treatment of ulcers related to *H. pylori*, combination therapy is typically recommended, such as a combination of the antibiotics *amoxicillin* and *clarithromycin*, along with an acid suppressing medication, such as *esomeprazole* (Nexium), *omeprazole* (Prilosec), or *lansoprazole* (Prevacid). These are proton pump inhibitors (PPIs). They decrease acid production in the stomach. Combination treatment with different medications, such as *metronidazole* (Flagyl), *tetracycline*, *bismuth* (Pepto-Bismol), and a PPI or a histamine receptor blocking agent, such as *cimetidine* (Tagamet), are other treatment options for peptic ulcers. When an ulcer is not caused by *H. pylori*, antibiotics are not necessary. A PPI or histamine receptor blocker alone may be effective.
