The Colorado County Fair Association (CCFA) offers 16 scholarships totaling \$13,250 to the youth of Colorado County annually.

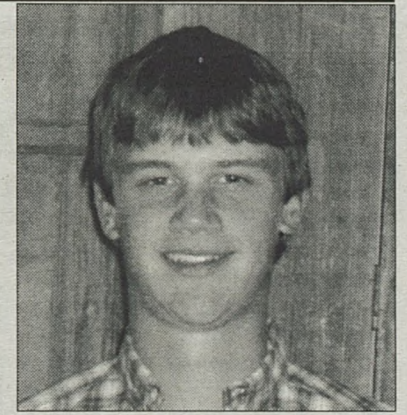

Tyler Baumach, son of Kristen and Russell Baumbach, who received \$1,000; and Jeremy Maupin, son of Tena and Roger Maupin, who received \$500.

The scholarship awarded Hobaugh, Huvar and Baumbach were given in memory of the late Eddie Orange of Columbus, who was a member of the CCFA's board of directors. Orange was also serving as president of the Colorado County Ag Complex Board at the time of his death. The scholarship awarded Kulhanek was given in memory of the late Sandra Robinson, a member of the CCFA's board of directors from 1999-2005. Robinson also served as Junior Fair Board Sponsor during that time. In addition, \$4,250 in scholarships was awarded to winners in the 2008 Fair Queen's Pageant. Fair Queen Kayla Gerik,

daughter of Rhonda and Doug Gerik, received the \$1,000 Leslie Schmidt Heard Memorial Scholarship. The late Heard was 1985 Fair Queen. Membership Queen Terri Prihoda, daughter of Sherry and Raymond Prihoda, received the \$2,000 Pamela Potter Honorary Scholarship for having sold the most advance season passes to the 2008 fair. Potter has served as pageant director since 1979, and has

been a member of CCFA's board of directors since 1981, currently holding the position of Executive Director, Emeritus. The first runner-up in sales, Koree Robinson, daughter of Mark Robinson and the late Sandra Robinson, received a \$750 scholarship. The second runner-up in sales, Brandy Rossignol, daughter of Geneva and Terry Rossignol, received a \$500 scholarship.



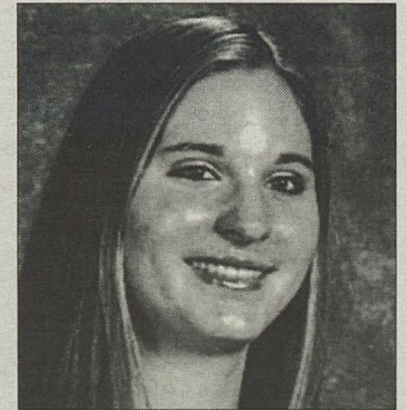
