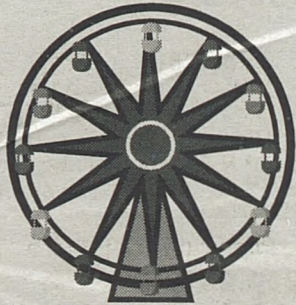
Pen Of Three Offered For Sale At Auction

11 pens of three of the best ranch raised heifers will be sold by local youth exhibitors. The bred status

of the animals will be announced at the time of sale. These heifers will be sold as a commercial pen of three by the junior exhibitors. Breeds represented will include F1, BxH, Brangus X, English and Exotic Crosses.
