Fire Departments Urge Burning Caution

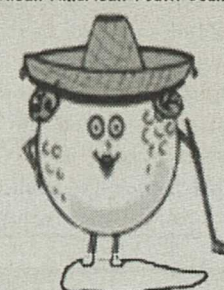
Now that the county wide burn ban has been lifted, are fire departments would like to remind county residents to use caution and report controlled burns.
