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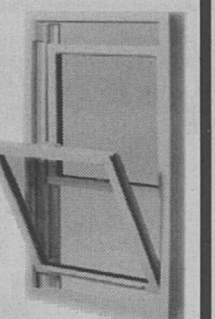
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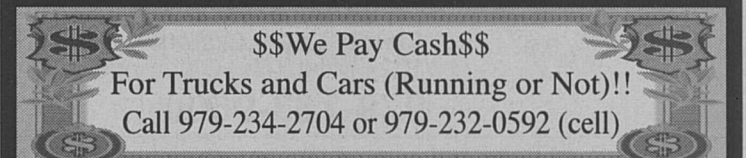
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H1N1 Prevention Tips Given

While you are still healthy and not showing any symptoms of H1N1 infection, in order to prevent proliferation, aggravation of symptoms and development of secondary infections, some very simple steps, not fully highlighted in most official communications, can be practiced (instead of focusing on how to stock N95 or Tamiflu):

Frequent hand-washing (well highlighted in all official commu-

nications).

"Hands-off-the-face" approach. Resist all temptations to touch any part of face (unless you want to eat or bathe).

Gargle twice a day with warm salt water (use Listerine if you don't trust salt.) H1N1 takes 2-3 days after initial infection in the throat/nasal cavity to proliferate and show characteristic symptoms.

Simple gargling prevents pro-

liferation. In a way, gargling with salt water has the same effect on a healthy individual that Tamiflu has on an infected one.

Don't underestimate this simple, inexpensive and powerful preventative method.

Similar to 3 above, clean your nostrils at least once every day with warm salt water.

Not everybody may be good at Jala Neti or Sutra Neti (Neti Pot), but blowing the nose hard once a day and swabbing both nostrils with cotton buds dipped in warm salt water is very effective in bringing down viral population.

Boost your natural immunity with foods that are rich in Vitamin C (Amla and other citrus fruits).

If you have to supplement with Vitamin C tablets, make sure that it also has Zinc to boost absorption.

Drink as much of warm liquids as you can. Drinking warm liquids has the same effect as gargling, but in the reverse direction.

They wash off proliferating viruses from the throat into the stomach where they cannot survive, proliferate or do any harm.

THC Marker Deadline Is November 30

The deadline for submitting applications to the Texas Historical Commission (THC) for a 2010 Official Texas Historical Marker is Nov. 30, 2009.

The THC is accepting applications on all topics, however priorities for 2010 focus on three themes including the arts, Recorded Texas Historic Landmarks and topics from 1945-1960.

Qualifying topics that address these themes will receive additional points when new applications are scored, helping to fill interpretive gaps in the Historical Marker Program.

There will be a numerical limit of 275 new applications in 2010 and an additional 20 markers will be produced utilizing accumulated Marker Application Funds that focus on untold marker stories to promote diversity of topics.

Potential sponsors interested in applying for a marker should first meet with their county historical commission (CHC) for assistance compiling their application and for guidance on local procedures and reviews.

The THC's marker staff encourages applicants to take advantage of the online support materials available at www.thc.state.tx.us/markerdesigns/madmark. shtml an effort to help save the real stories and designate the historic places where they actually occurred.

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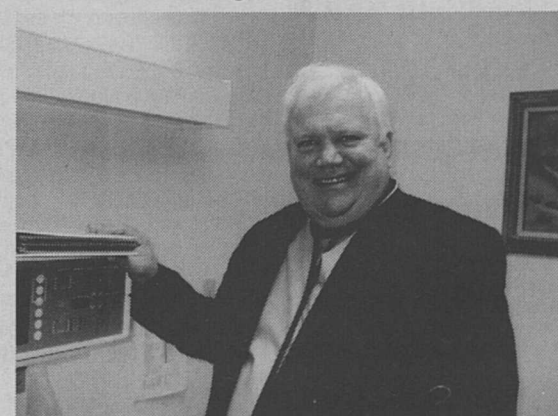
