Two Civil Suits In District Court

Two civil suits were filed in the last week in Colorado County District Court.

On Oct. 7, Ronnie Joe Simicek filed suit against George Douglas Goode.

The case involves a motor vehicle collision on Oct. 19, 2007.

The suit states that Simicek was westbound in the 1400 block of Walnut in Columbus when his vehicle was struck from the rear by a vehicle driven by Goode. The suit claims that Simicek suffered serious physical injuries in the collision.

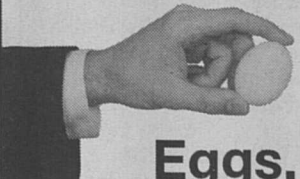
The suit involves a home equity note on May 25, 2007 for \$65,000 for property at 1013 Jackson in Columbus. The suit claims

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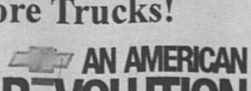
