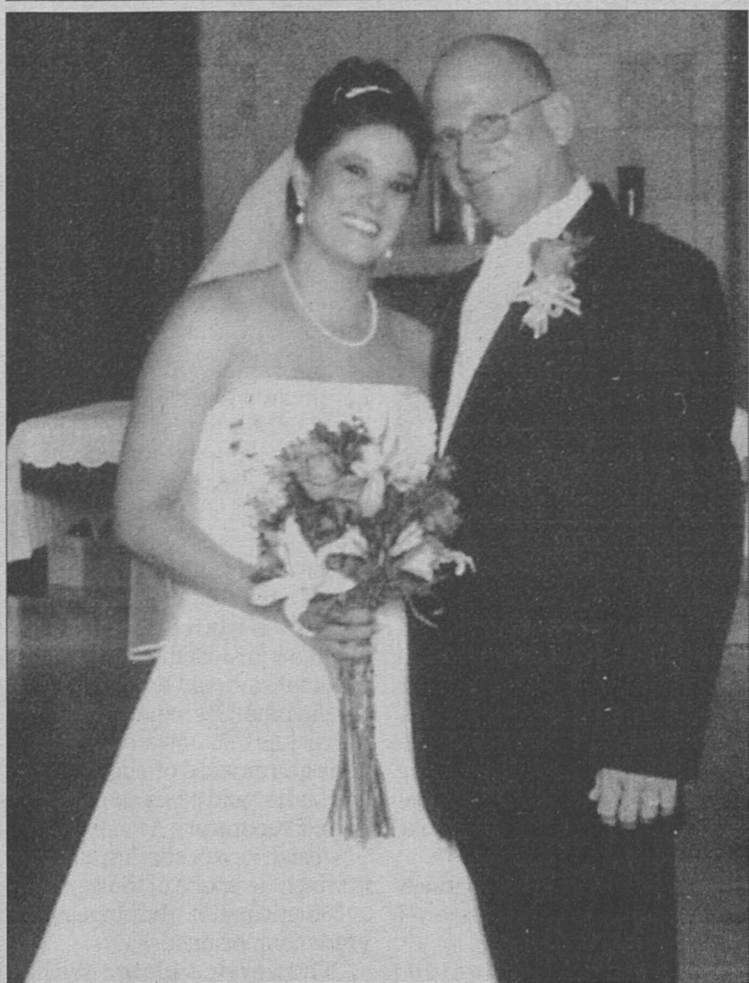




Mr. and Mrs. Neal Marsalia

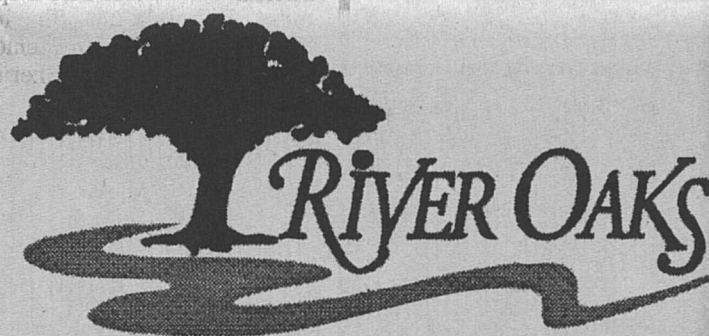
