

History Made Humorous By Museum In Weimar

The Heritage Society Museum (HSM) of Weimar presents, "Cartooning Texas: One Hundred Years of Cartoon Art in the Lone Star State."

According to The World Book Encyclopedia, "the word cartoon refers to a humorous or satiric picture intended to hold up to ridicule some public man, party, or movement."

Practically all of the great daily papers, as well as many maga-

zines, have such sketches, and they play a large part in recording history."

Selections from the Decade of Beginnings (1890-1899) through a Time of Change (1980-1990) are represented in this exhibit.

These cartoons about the political life and times of Texans were compiled by Maury Forman and Robert A. Calvert.

Mr. Foreman is the co-founder and managing director of Cartoon, Inc., a corporation devoted to presenting cartoons as educational tools, historical records, and cultural artifacts.

Mr. Calvert is a professor of history at Texas A&M University and a past president of the Texas State Historical Association.

This exhibit opened with a viewing by the Weimar Garden Club on Friday, October 9 and will remain in the museum through October 31.

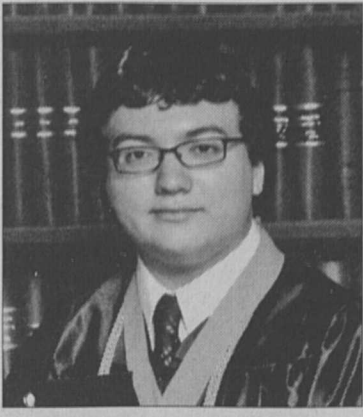
Regular museum hours are 2-4 p.m. on Wednesdays and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday.

New items added this year offered by River Star Farms will be cookie dough, cobblers, pies, brownies cheesecakes, cinnamon rolls, pumpkin rolls and jumbo pretzels.
