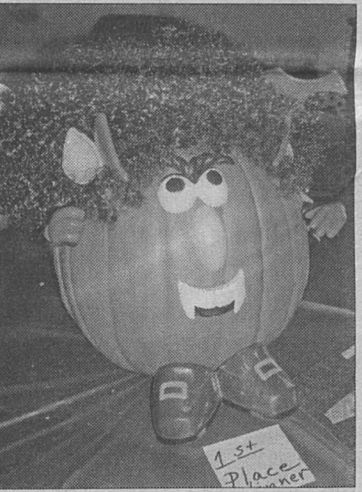

Did You Know?

According to the National Fire Protection Association, each year plays witness to millions of fires, thousands of deaths and injuries, and billions of dollars in losses.
Between the years of 1999 and 2008, there was an average of more than 1.6 million fires that resulted in roughly \$11.6 billion in direct dollar losses.
Figures do not reflect the events of September 11, 2001, but each year saw approximately 3,625 Americans lose their lives and nearly 19,000 more Americans suffer injuries resulting from fires.
Those figures have remained relatively steady over the years, with only the events of September 11, 2001, and the Southern California wildfires of 2003 causing a significant spike in the number of lives and dollars lost.
Of the civilian fatalities during this period, 83 percent occurred in the home.

Little League meeting Nov. 17

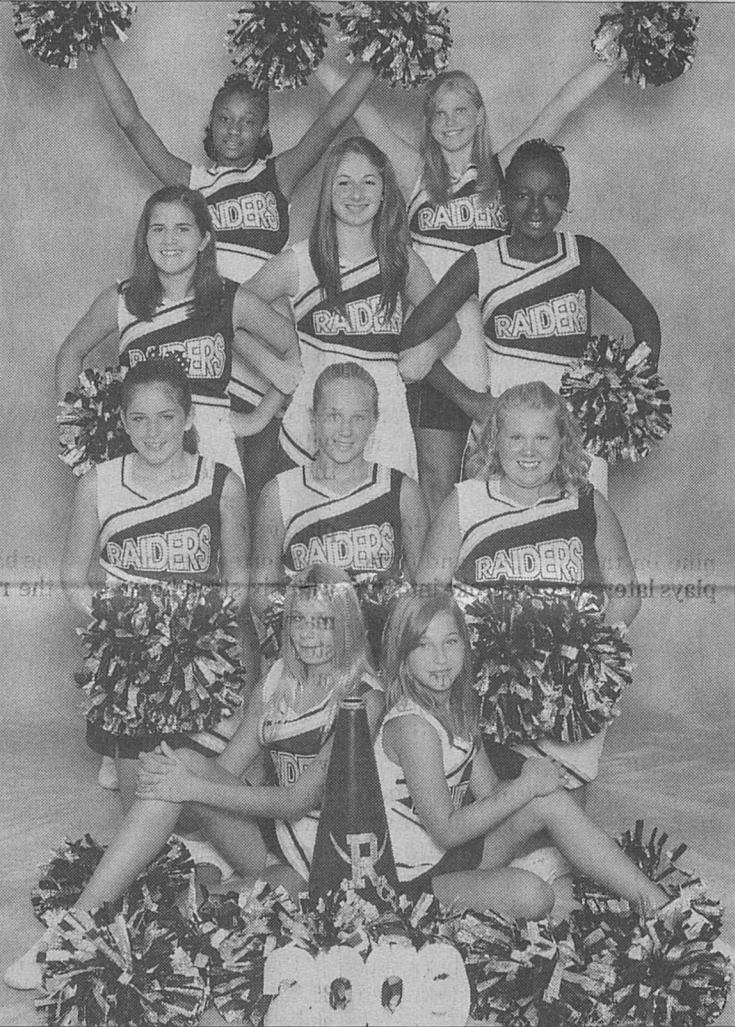
