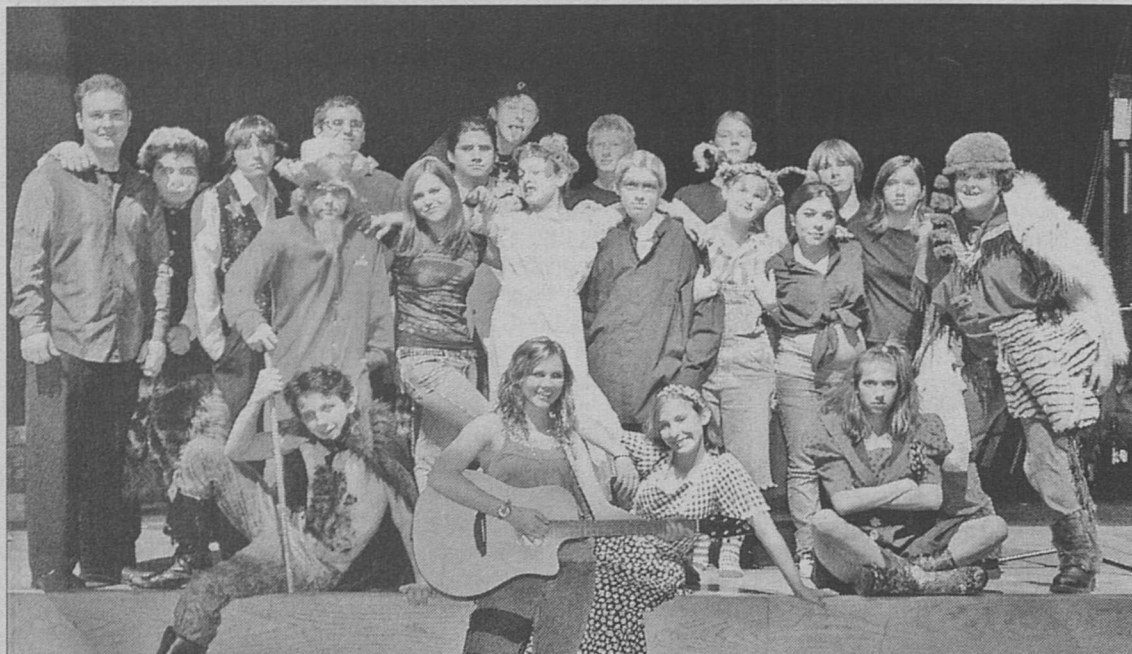
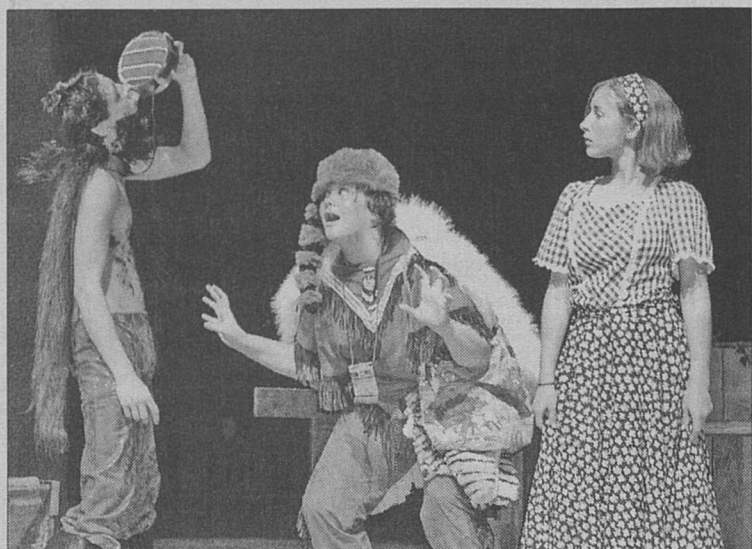

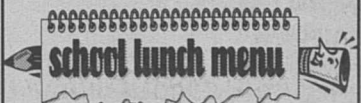
Next year Nicole plans to attend Texas State University to begin her studies in public relations.
