Raiders Take On Harper In Area

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has thrown for 1,350 yards and 12 touchdowns. He has also run for 411 and 12 touchdowns.

Their leading rusher is Reagan Randle and has 1,120 yards and 14 touchdowns on the year. He is also the leading receiver with 490 yards and 7 touchdowns.

Two other receivers, Johnny

Martinez and Jovan Middleton, have combined for 750 yards and 3 touchdowns.

Rice quarterback Myles Dumont has thrown for 1,447 yards and 14 touchdowns on the year.

Mario Hull has 44 receptions for 970 yards and 11 scores on the season. He also returned two kick-offs and a punt for touchdowns

this season and has intercepted 6 passes on the defensive side of the ball.

Leading rusher on the year for Rice is Michael Scott with 418 yards and 4 touchdowns. Terrance Shorter has 381 yards and 5 touchdowns.

Raiders Beat Lexington For Area Berth

fending off a possible Lexington comeback effort.

Rice took care of the ball on offense, committing no turnovers on the evening.

Quarterback Myles Dumont was 11 of 16 for 163 yards and two touchdowns.

Terrance Shorter had the bulk of the carries for the Raiders, going for 79 yards on 20 rushes.

Rice started the game with the ball on the 29 and ran Shorter twice for five yards.

Hull made his first catch on the next play for seven and a first down.

After two more runs, Dumont went back to Hull for 11 and another first down near midfield.

Shorter ran for seven more, before Hull got behind the defense and scored on a 43-yard strike from Dumont.

Cristian Samaniego nailed the point after for a 7-0 Rice lead with 8:06 left in the first quarter.

Lexington started their first drive on the 27.

They ran twice to the 44, but on the next play Chris Dorsey made a tackle for a four-yard loss.

They gained 15 on the next play to the Rice 45.

A holding penalty pushed them back ten yards, and two plays later Damien Stevens came up with a huge sack for the Raiders, making it third and 29.

After trading five-yard penalties, Lexington threw incomplete

on third down and was forced to punt.

Rice took over at the 25, and immediately began moving downfield.

Shorter ran for 10, and then Dumont threw to Hull for 28 yards down to the Lexington 37.

Shorter ran for 20 more on the next play to the 17.

After a short run, and two incompletions, Ryan Moore attempted a 31-yard field goal. It was wide and Lexington took over at the 20.

Lexington went back to the running game and pushed downfield, mixing in two passes along the way.

They would make it as far as the Raider 15, where they faced a third and one.

Stevens caught the runner in the backfield for a five-yard loss and forced a field goal try.

Lexington made the 37-yarder and the score was 7-3 with 7:29 left in the second quarter.

The Raiders answered the Lexington score immediately.

Hull fielded the ensuing kickoff at the 11-yard line and took it 89 yards back for a touchdown.

Samaniego made the point after and Rice was up 14-3 with 7:17 left in the half.

The Raider defense held strong on the next Lexington possession.

The Eagles faced a third and two after to runs and J. J. Reg-

A personal foul on Lexington following the punt gave Rice excellent field position at the Eagle 43.

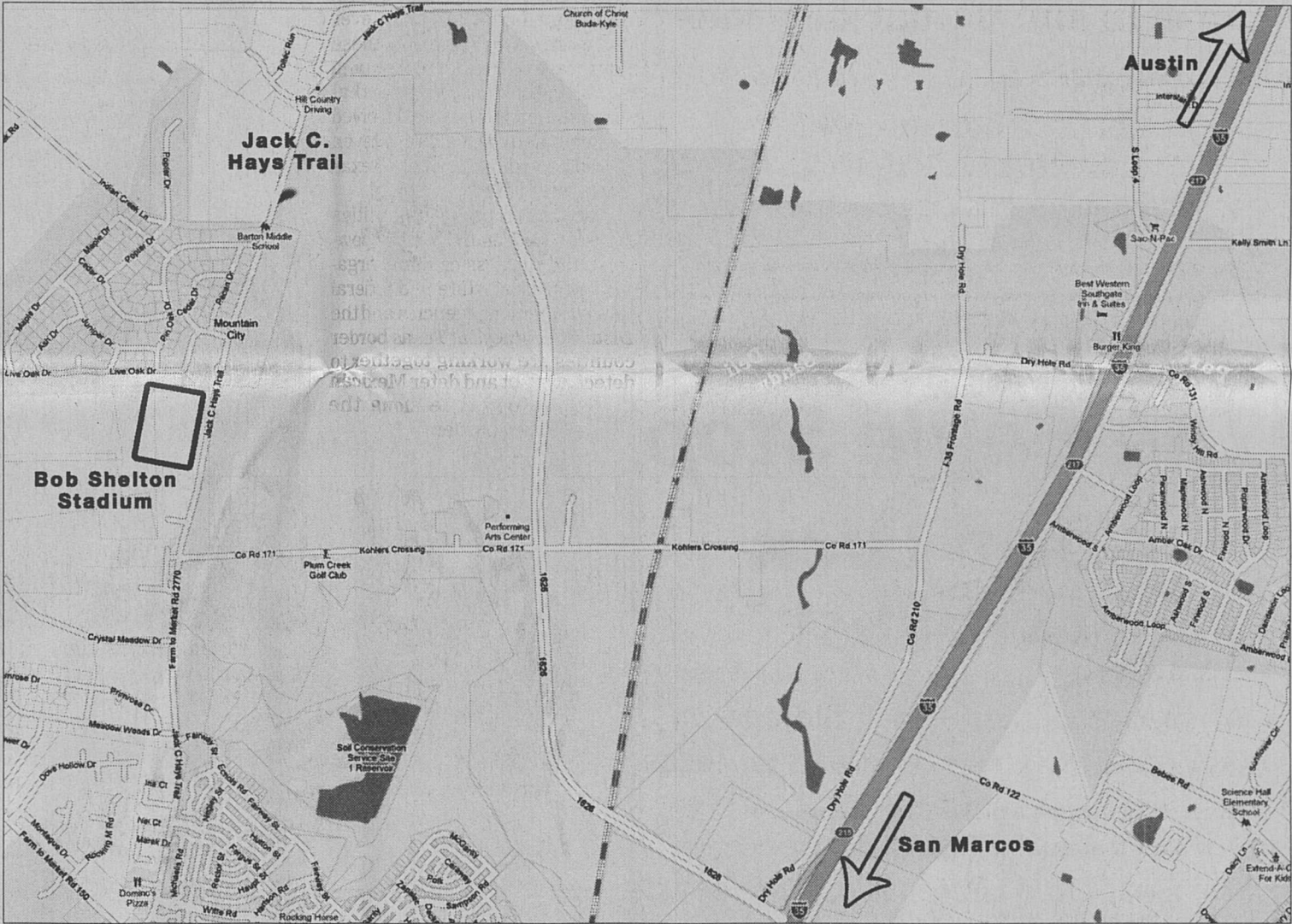
The first play was a pass to Hull for 13 yards.
