Simply count the number of times the symbol appears, and send in your answer to the Headlight. Entry form on page 2.

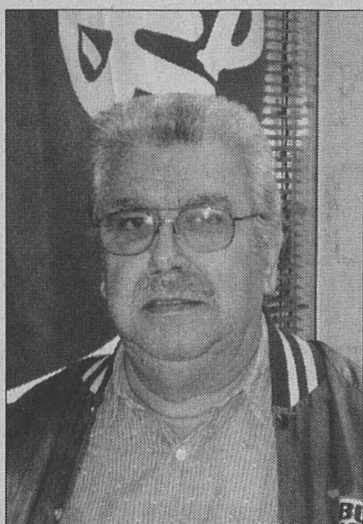
All correct entries, submitted by the deadline, will be eligible for a weekly drawing.

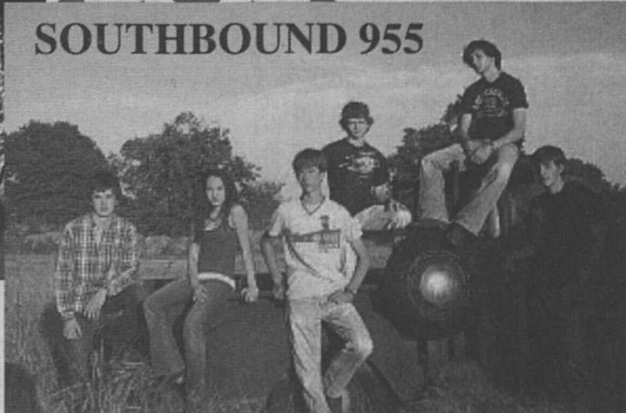
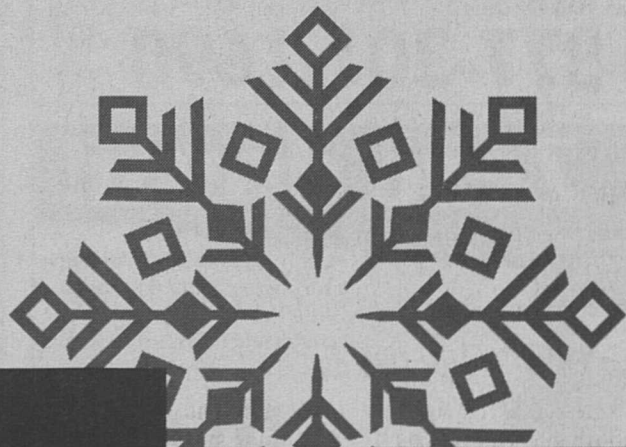
