



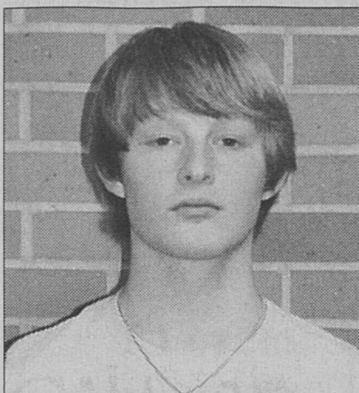
Perfect Attendance Awards

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SPILL PROOF CUPS

Most parents are aware of the damage to the teeth caused by putting a child to sleep with a bottle of milk or other sweetened beverage. Now, a recent study suggests that the prolonged use of spill-proof cups with bill shaped extensions can be just as damaging as a bottle.

This damage is caused by milk or other carbohydrate containing liquids staying on the teeth and allowing bacteria that are normally present in the mouth to attack that teeth by forming "plaque acids." These acids create holes in the teeth (cavities) and can lead to deeper infections of the tiny nerves within them. The susceptibility to cavities is also increased because the flow of protective saliva is greatly reduced during sleep.

If your child must use a bottle or spill-proof cup at bedtime, substitute water or something unsweetened, or use a pacifier.

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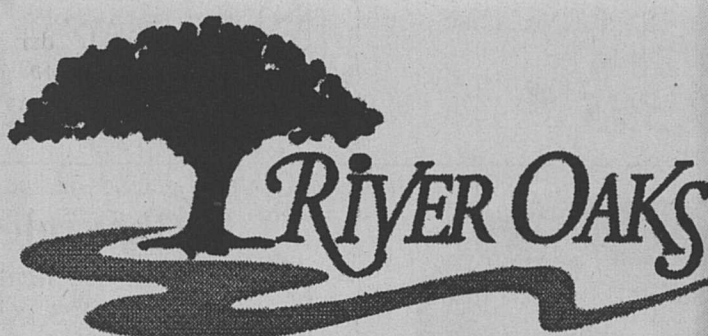
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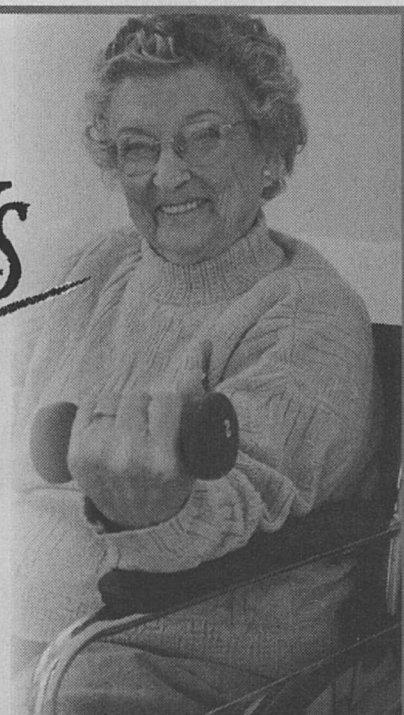
