Antibiotics for Pneumonia Prevention

Pneumonia is an inflammation of the lungs. It is caused by an infection. Although pneumonia can occur at any age, persons over 65 years of age are more likely to be affected. Persons who smoke are also at an increased risk of developing pneumonia. Symptoms may be similar to the flu, including a cough and fever. Other common symptoms include shortness of breath, sweating, chills, and muscle pain. Community-acquired pneumonia (CAP) is a specific type of pneumonia that is commonly acquired at school or work. This type of pneumonia is commonly caused by the bacteria *streptococcus pneumoniae*.

A family of antibiotics, which include azithromycin (*Zithromax*) and clarithromycin (*Biaxin*), may be prescribed for those who were healthy prior to pneumonia infection. For individuals with other conditions at the time of the infection, such as diabetes or a chronic heart condition, a fluoroquinolone-type antibiotic, such as moxifloxacin (*Avelox*) or levofloxacin (*Levaquin*) may be prescribed. Alternatively, a combination of a beta-lactam antibiotic, such as amoxicillin (*Amoxil*), and an antibiotic like azithromycin may be prescribed. In addition, persons 65 years of age and older and others with chronic conditions are recommended to receive the pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine.

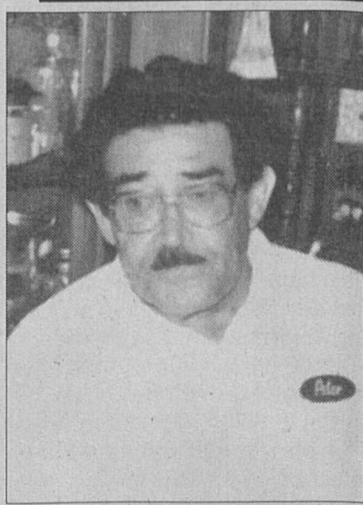

It's Girl Scout Cookie Time!

January means a lot of different things to a lot of different people: coats and hats, football playoffs and Bowl games, New Year resolution...

But to Girl Scouts in the Central Texas Council, which includes Colorado County, it means Cookie Time!!

Yes, the tradition continues, with the return of your favorite cookies: Thin Mints, Shortbread, Caramel deLites, Peanut Butter Patties, Peanut Butter Sandwiches, Lemonades, Thanks-A-Lots and Daisy-Go-Rounds.

Last year, Girl Scouts in Central Texas sold 2.1 million boxes of cookies.

Each box sells for \$3.50, and \$2.65 from every box sold directly supports Girl Scouting in Central Texas. (The other \$0.85 pays for the cookie itself.)

The money raised by cookie sales keeps our Girl Scout camps and houses running, our educational outreach programs going, and finances individual troop activities including service projects.

Girls benefit not only from the money generated by the sale, but by the skills they develop by participating in the sale.

Girl Scouts prepare for the annual sale through programs focused on goal setting, safe selling, money management and public speaking.

Older girls can become Cookie Captains and practice their leadership skills by teaching younger girls how to be smart and successful during the cookie sale.

Many older girls practice corporate sales by writing a formal letter or giving a presentation asking a company to purchase cookies.

This technique improves communication skills while exposing girls to professional settings.

If your New Year resolution involved cutting down on calories, remember, there are only about 150 calories per serving (a serving is usually two cookies, except in the case of the Thin Mints where you can eat four).

And, the Daisy-Go-Rounds come in convenient 100 calorie packs. And if this still seems too rich for you, you can buy boxes of cookies for our soldiers.

Last year, through Operation Cookie, Girl Scouts of Central Texas and their customers donated 44,000 boxes of cookies to US soldiers, accompanied by the girl's letters of thanks for the service men and women's devotion to their country.

We now have a total of eight troops in Eagle Lake and Columbus, ranging from Daisies (kindergartners) to Cadettes (in Junior High) and anyone of these fine ladies will be glad to sell you a box or two, or three...

Hey! If you buy five boxes of cookies, you can enter a drawing to win a year's supply of Girl Scout Cookies! A dream come true!

And don't forget to look for the Cookie Booths at the Columbus Walmart, Eagle Lake Brookshire Brothers, Eagle Lake downtown and other areas throughout Colorado County.
