

Rice Raider Basketball Team Loses To Brazos, Beats East Bernard

The Rice Raider varsity basketball team lost to Brazos on Feb. 9, 39-48.

The Raiders scored 12 points in the first quarter; eight in the second; six in the third; and 13 in the fourth quarter.

Brazos scored five in the first; 14 in the second; 16 in the third; and 13 in the fourth.

Scoring for the Raiders were Corey Farrow with 12; Damian Stevens, 11; Cody Lantelme, five; Myles Dumont and Terris Shorter, four points each; Jared Kaster rounded out the scoring with three points.

Rebound leader was Farrow with 11; Kaster, 10; Stevens, four; Lantelme and Spencer Spencer, three; Dumont, two; and Shorter, one rebound.

The Raider beat East Bernard on Feb. 12, 60-47.

The Raiders scored 18 points in the first quarter; 16 in the second; eight in the third; and 18 in the fourth quarter.

East Bernard scored eight in the first quarter; 11 in the second; nine in the third; and 19 in the fourth.

Scoring in double digits on the night were Lantelme with 33; and Stevens with 10.

Other scorers were Dumont with nine; Kaster and Farrow with four points each.

Tied in rebounds with seven each were Kaster and Farrow; Lantelme, six; Stevens, three; Dumont and Spencer, one each.

Hallettsville beat the Raiders 88-33 on Feb. 16.

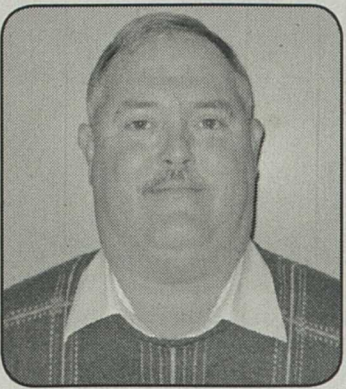
The Raiders scored six points in the first quarter; 10 in the second; seven in the third; and 10 in the fourth quarter.

--Patrick Hrcncir, 64, of Hallettsville, who was the driver of a 1999 Chevrolet.

--Ross Michael Wedelich, 16, of Rosharon, the driver of a 2003 Toyota Carryall, and a passenger Hayley Wedelich, 15, of Rosharon.

The teenagers, a brother and sister, were identified as students at Angleton High School and were reportedly on their way to show a steer at the San Antonio Livestock Show.

The three were pronounced dead at the scene by Peace Justice Francis Truchard.

The accident was investigated by DPS Trooper Stephen Pierce. He was assisted by Sgt. Gary Chandler and troopers David Sutton, Orlando Moreno, and Elizabeth Tolbert.

Colorado County sheriff's officers also assisted at the scene.

grant for lighting improvements, they need to have a long-term use contract in place with the district.

-Trustees were told that work is on schedule at the Eagle Lake Intermediate School and should be complete by the April 1 completion date.

-Ordered an election for May 8 to board positions 4 and 5, held by Jack Vawter and Carolyn Baird.

-Approved election workers for the May 8 election.

-Approved annual campus improvement plans.

-Accepted a donation of fitness equipment from Columbus Physical Therapy.

-Approved the school calendar for 2010-2011. The only major change is that two in-service days will be moved to the Monday and Tuesday before Thanksgiving and students will be off that week.

-At a previous meeting, the board approved a contract extension for Superintendent Michael Lanier. His contract was extended one year, through June 2013, at a salary of \$96,000, an increase of \$2,000 over the previous contract.

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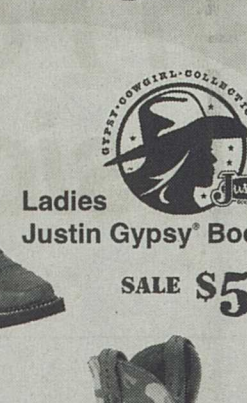
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
