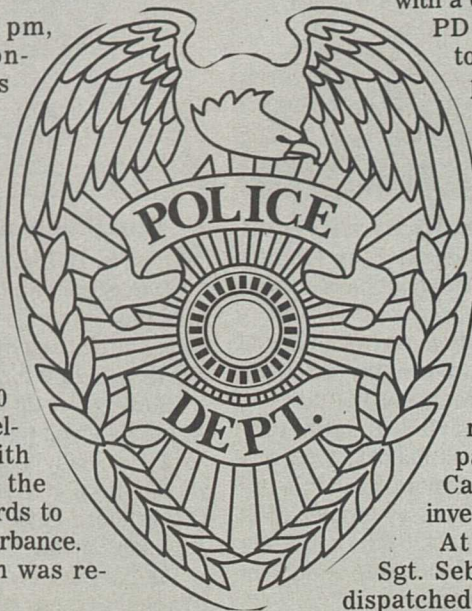

Three individuals were sentenced in Colorado County District Court on Monday, April 5. They included:

The training was conducted during the week of March 8th - 12th.

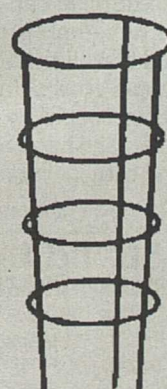
