Rice FFA Members Compete In Houston

Rice High School FFA members recently competed in the Junior Commercial Steer Feeding and Management Contest at Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo. Representing Rice FFA were senior Brian Kallina, junior Michael Waligura, freshman Katie Pagel, and freshman Danielle Dopslauf. The students spent months preparing for the competition by feeding and monitoring their steers daily. They were aided in their efforts by Ag teacher Monte Williams, Coaches David and Debbie Little and Dr. Stephen Golla and Consultants Delmar Krenek and Frank and Monica Staff. The Junior Commercial Steer Feeding and Management Contest encourages Texas 4-H and

FFA members to participate in a practical beef production program. Emphasis on feeding economy is not only recommended, but is a prerequisite for entry in this show. Entrants are required to submit a letter of intent prior to beginning their program. Each entry consists of a pen of three steers. Along with raising a pen of steers, exhibitors are required to complete a quiz, oral interview, and submit a completed record book of all feedings and weights from the previous months. Additional scoring is based on the each steer's quality and yield grade, the cost per pound gained, the average daily gain, and the feed conversion production. Exhibitors must complete all phases of the contest and score a minimum number of points in order to receive premium moneys.

Steers receiving ribbons will be sold, by grade and weight, at a special sale. Steers below the grade of Select will be sold at the sale after all other steers of a higher grade are sold. The regular marketing cost, including trucking expenses to the livestock market, will be borne by the exhibitor and deducted from the sale proceeds. This is a practical, commercially fed steer show. All steers entered in the contest will be sold at the sale. The Rice students competed against approximately 114 other FFA/4H members. Kallina placed in the top eight and was required to undergo an additional interview and placed 6th overall. Waligura, Pagel and Dopslauf and did well in the competition with Pagel and Dopslauf in their rookie year.
