The club is active in the community planting and maintaining pocket parks throughout Columbus. It also offers scholarships to students entering college in a horticultural field of study.

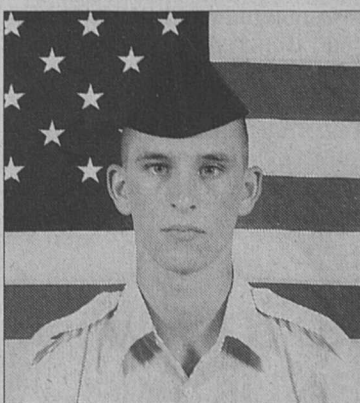
