Trash Off Day A 'Great Success'

Forty-three volunteers came together at City Hall to participate in the Great Texas Trash-Off on April 10th.

This is the single largest one day cleanup event in the state and is part of the Great American Cleanup, the nation's largest community improvement program.

The volunteers were divided into teams with four to five people per team. Each volunteer wore an orange safety vest and was given trash bags, gloves and water.

There were three goals for this year's volunteers: Clean up litter on our streets and highways, clean up the city park creek and clean up old tires.

All three were met with great success. Because of their effort, litter filling 200 large trash bags and weighing over 4,000 pounds was removed from the highways.

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County Commissioners Discuss Removal Of Building For Annex

Colorado County commissioners, meeting Monday, discussed advertising for dismantling and removing the white frame building at 1119 Travis.

County Judge Al Jamison said that he was concerned that the county might not receive any bids to buy the structure and remove it.

County Commissioner Darrell Gertson said the county might consider advertising online at a government website.

Jamison noted that the deadline for submitting bids to purchase the building is Friday,

April 30.

In other matters, the commissioners:

--Approving including under its contract with Volz and Associates the boring under Travis Street and installing underground conduit for the new courthouse annex.

--Selected Weishuhn Engineering of Columbus to provide civil engineering services on the courthouse annex at a cost of \$6,750.

--Selected Clifford Wenske and Paul Blymer as to county representatives to serve on an air zoning committee for Robert

R. Wells Airport.

The committee would be involved in setting building height restrictions on approaches to the airport.

--Appointed Kay Story to the Colorado County Historical Commission.

--Discussed briefly seeking better interest rates on county accounts.

--Approved a request by the Columbus Chamber of Commerce to use Beason's Park on June 19 from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. for a "Junk in the Park" citywide garage sale.
