Jobe Finishes Pharmacy Doctorate

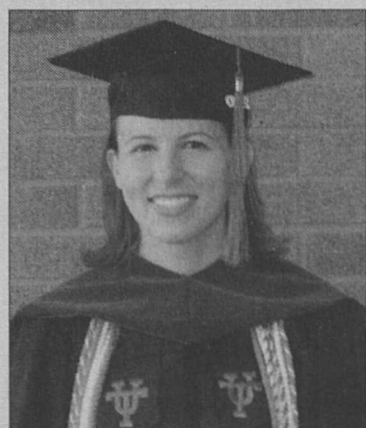
Lori Ann Jobe, a 2001 graduate and valedictorian of Rice Consolidated High School has graduated with a Doctor of Pharmacy degree.

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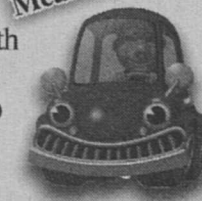
