later transported to the Colorado County Detention Center.

Sunday, Sept. 16, at 1:15 a.m., Officer Nelson was dispatched to a suspicious male being in the hospital parking lot. Norman Henderson Jr. was located and found in possession of marijuana. Henderson was arrested and processed at the ELPD.

At 3:45 a.m., Sgt. Lattimore assisted the Weimar Police Department in a homicide investigation, resulting from a fatal shooting which had occurred in the street, near a club in Weimar.

At 4:33 a.m., Officer Nelson was dispatched to Johnny's Sport Shop in regards the building being burglarized. A number of firearms were stolen. Sgt. Crume developed two juvenile suspects after a witness reportedly saw two suspicious males outside the shop Saturday night.

Tuesday, Sept. 18, the two juvenile males, ages 10 and 14, were magistered at the police department by Justice of the Peace Larry Dulaney and were placed in the Colorado County Juvenile Detention Facility.

Twelve firearms have been recovered, but as of 5 p.m. Sept. 18, several more were still unaccounted for. Leads have been developed as to the location of the remaining firearms. These leads are being followed up as

of press time.

At 3:15 p.m., Officer Perez was met at the ELPD by a complainant in regards to a stolen bike. Information was taken and a report made.

At 10:37 p.m., Lt. Johnson was dispatched to the FM 3013 Place Apartments in regards to a disturbance. He arrived and spoke with the two subjects. No charges were filed.

Monday, Sept. 17, Hector Granillo Jr. pled guilty in the 25th Judicial District Court before Judge Dwight Peschel to the Jan. 4, 2001, murder of Delores "Lalo" Cordova.

Granillo was sentenced to 15 years in the Texas Department of Corrections (TDC). He was the last of three murder defendants who pled guilty in this murder case.

The first to plead guilty was Gilbert Mendoza Jr. who received 45 years in TDC. The second was Roberto Mindieta who was sentenced to 35 years in TDC.

Chief Webb said his investigation into this case will continue as he investigates the destruction of physical evidence in this case by certain family members of the defendants.

Also on Sept. 17, Billy Joe Clark pled guilty to the Aug. 31, 2001, burglary of an apartment at 400 W. Prairie which was investigated by the ELPD.

Clark also pled guilty to two separate counts of sexual assault.

He received a total of 20 years in TDC on the three charges. Clark will also have to register as a sex offender when he is released from prison.

At 1:53 p.m., Lt. Johnson observed a white Chrysler Fifth Avenue with a defective stop (brake) lamp in the 500 block of E. Main St.

Lt. Johnson made contact with the driver, Lloyd Mercadel. Mercadel was arrested for driving without a driver's license and was transported to the ELPD where he was processed.

Lt. Johnson later released Mercadel after issuing him a citation for driving with no driver's license.

At 7:20 p.m., Officer Lasley was dispatched to 1345 Murphy St. in regards to a broken mini-van window. It was determined the window was accidentally broken by a neighbor who was mowing grass.

At 10:57 p.m., Officer Lasley was dispatched to the Eagle Lake Super Stop in regards to a theft. Lasley arrived and learned that a female suspect had come into the store and taken four packs of playing cards with out paying for them. One suspect has been identified. Charges are pending.

There were a number of calls throughout the week in reference to a certain individual in town who was going door to door attempting to sell citizens various items of property.

This individual has a history of such behavior and a criminal record stemming from theft.

If you are approached by anyone who is attempting to sell you used or reportedly new items door to door, please contact the ELPD.
