November Drill Permits Down

November Permits to Drill

The Railroad Commission issued a total of 1,258 original drilling permits in November 2006 compared to 1,552 in November 2005.

The November total included 1,090 permits to drill new oil and gas wells, 54 to re-enter existing well bores, and 114 for re-completions.

Permits issued in November

2006 included 263 oil, 290 gas, 666 oil and gas, 33 injection, three service and three other permits.

October Crude Oil Production

Texas preliminary October 2006 crude oil production averaged 888,494 barrels daily, down from the 898,326 barrels daily average of October 2005.

The preliminary Texas crude oil production figure for October

2006 is 27,982,144 barrels, an increase from 27,898,512 barrels reported during October 2005.

November Oil, Gas Completions

In November 2006, operators reported 423 oil, 846 gas, 20 injection and one other completion compared to 293 oil, 631 gas, 31 injection and six other completions during November 2005.

Total well completions for 2006 year to date are 12,308 up from 10,058 recorded during the same period in 2005.

Operators reported 299 holes plugged and three dry holes in November 2006 compared to 693 holes plugged and zero dry holes in November 2005.

October Natural Gas Production

Texas oil and gas wells produced 470,732,283 Mcf (thousand cubic feet) of gas based upon preliminary production figures for October 2006, up from the October 2005 preliminary gas production total of 425,420,550 Mcf.

Texas production in October 2006 came from 132,851 oil and 72,773 gas wells.
