J. V. Frnka Makes Reply to Letter Received From H. Knebel.

Weimar, Tex., April 23, 1914.
Mr. Jos. V. Frnka, Columbus:
Dear Sir—It has been reported to me that in the event you were elected representative to the legislature from this district, you would favor statutory prohibition or other antagonistic changes in the liquor laws of this state.

FRNKA'S REPLY.

Columbus, Tex., April 27, 1914.
Mr. H. Knebel, Weimar, Tex.:

Dear Sir and Friend—Yours of the 23rd inst. to hand, and in reply I wish to state that I have not given out any statement nor authorized any one to do so for me, outlining my course in regard to the matter you mention.

This report, regardless of by whom circulated, is false and without any foundation whatsoever. I am opposed to statutory prohibition or any change in the laws governing the liquor business in this state.

I am also opposed to submission of the prohibition amendment

to the constitution because a statewide prohibition election was held only a few years ago, and I think that there are other important matters of public interest to which the next legislature should devote its attention instead of killing time on this one question, which should be settled for a while at least.

If elected to represent the people of Colorado and Austin counties, I shall vote on all bills to the best interest and according to the sentiment and wishes of my constituents, so far as they come to my knowledge, and I can state to you that I know the feeling of the people of this district on the prohibition question.

It is absurd for any one to presume that I would oppose the will of those who, through the ballot box, had expressed their confidence in me, by electing me to this honorable position.

I hope I have clearly defined my position on the question of your inquiry, and inasmuch as this is a matter of public interest I am taking the liberty of giving a copy of your letter and this reply thereto to the press.
